<u>SB 567 B-Eng.</u>	<u>SFR</u>	do pass as amended, print engrossed	5/12/2015
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Directs Department of Revenue to retain un-receipted income tax revenue from capital gains income. Defines method of calculating excess capital gains revenue as the difference between the average revenue over the most recent two tax years compared to average revenue in the two previous years. If the most recent revenue exceeds the previous period, the excess is deposited in the Education Stability Fund. Directs Department of Administrative Services to estimate excess capital gains revenue. **Senate Amendment Replaces Bill** (Committee Vote: Aye, 5)

<u>HB 2176 B-Eng.</u>	<u>SRULES</u>	do pass as amended (Committee)	7/2/2015	Rosenbaum
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Removes requirement that person elected to county office provide county clerk with certificate of election. Requires electronic filing of candidate's nominating petition or declaration of candidacy for primary election. Changes certain ballot markings from "Presidential only" to "Federal only." Alters certain filing deadlines. Adds prospective petition to requirement that full text of measure being circulated must be carried by signature-gatherers and available for review. Removes requirement that signature sheets for initiative or referral petition be attached to full and correct copy of measure. Requires Secretary of State (SOS) to establish process for modifying petition templates. Requires that one copy of prospective initiative and referral petitions be sent to required officials, rather than two. Permits district attorney to make clerical corrections to ballot title for district measure. Requires all estimates, portraits, statements and arguments for voters' pamphlet to be filed electronically. Requires that district elections authority include ballot title for district election on measure at the time measure is submitted to county elections officials. Provides person, to whom civil penalty may be imposed, ability to request hearing 20 days from service date on notice. Directs SOS to prepare and allow electors, chief petitioners and their agents to use electronic signature sheets to collect signatures for prospective initiative petition. Requires SOS to verify signatures in certain instances where county clerks currently verify signatures. Establishes July 1, 2015 as date for determining total number of voters registered with minor party in order for party to maintain status as minor political party for 2016 general election. Declares emergency, effective on passage. **Senate Amendment Establishes July 1, 2015 as date for determining total number of voters registered with minor party in order for party to maintain status as minor political party for 2016 general election. Removes reference "to excess of any amount (campaign contribution) necessary to defray expenditures" regarding use of contributions by campaign committees to resolve account debt. Removes change to**

HB 2015 A-Eng. **JWM** **do pass** **7/3/2015** **Steiner Hayward**

Requires Department of Human Services (DHS) adopt rules for employment-related day care subsidies that allow parents to attend school; permit one year certifications regardless of changes in employment status; and extend benefits to self-employed parents. Reduces payment and co-pay system for child care facilities that meet tiered quality standards. Directs DHS to structure co-pays to mitigate financial impact upon program exit. Directs Early Learning Council (ELC) to develop voluntary statewide early learning system and defines requirements. Establishes process for defining "affordable, quality child care." Directs Early Learning Division (ELD) to develop and implement quality improvement system for exempt family providers no later than July 1, 2016. Directs ELC to provide training and technical assistance. Requires ELC plans be integrated with existing early childhood services, intervention plans, and federal and state law. Directs ELD conduct study and report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Thomsen, Whitsett)

Requires the Legislative Revenue Office to conduct a study on restructuring Oregon's state and local revenue system. (Committee Vote: Aye, 14)

Requires campaign finance statement to be filed in ORESTAR within two business days after single contribution or expenditure of \$2,500 or more is made, if it occurs during 14-day period immediately preceding election. Establishes 15-member Task Force on Campaign Finance Reform. Specifies membership, charge and reporting requirement. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 15; Nay, 9 --McLane, Smith, Whisnant, Whitsett, Girod, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett, Winters)

Establishes Task Force on Class Sizes to determine appropriate class sizes of students, identify
methods to reduce class sizes, and determine cost for methods to reduce class sizes. Declares
emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 21; Nay, 3 --Whitsett, Thomsen,
Whitsett)

HB 2931 B-Eng. **JWM** **do pass** **7/3/2015** **Dembrow**

Requires Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to disseminate to each school district information relating
to elevated radon levels. Specifies types of information to be included. Directs each school district
to develop a plan for schools where the radon levels are elevated. Specifies criteria for the plans.
Directs school district to submit the plan to OHA on or before September 1, 2016. Exempts any
school that has been tested for radon on or after January 1, 2006. Declares an emergency,
effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Aye, 19; Nay, 4 --Whitsett, Hansell, Thomsen, Whitsett;
Exc., 1 --Burdick)

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HB 3380 A-Eng. **JWM** **do pass** **7/3/2015** **Monroe**

HB 3380 directs the Early Learning Division of the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to administer a program that expands preschool options available in the state. This "mixed delivery" preschool program is to be coordinated by the early learning hubs in their region; who are to apply for funding for the program and contract with preschool providers. The preschool programs eligible for financing through the program must meet a set of criteria including the following: Must be a new program or be expanding their program; provides at least the annual number of instructional hours as a full-day Kindergarten program does; considers the scheduling needs of families; serves children age 3 to age 5 (kindergarten eligible); serves families whose incomes are less than 200% of the federal poverty level; provides services from infant to early elementary grades; works with community programs and others to make sure families have knowledge of community supports available to families; meets certain quality measures including having lead teachers who have at least a bachelor's degree or have a plan to get the degree as well as having the lead teacher paid at least at the minimum amount set by the Early Learning Council; and provides additional supports for children and their families.
