Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>SJR 17</u>	Judiciary Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to recognize right to privacy.
<u>SB 605</u>	Finance and Revenue Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to set schedule for allocation of lottery moneys to pay lottery bond principal, interest and premium due.
<u>SB 621</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood Prohibits eye bank, tissue bank, procurement organization, hospital or physician from considering any disability of potential recipient of anatomical gift except to extent that disability makes potential recipient medically unsuitable to receive anatomical gift.
<u>SB 622</u>	Judiciary Adds legislative staff and personal support workers to list of mandatory reporters of abuse of children, elderly persons and other vulnerable persons.
<u>SB 625</u>	Health Care Regulates pharmacy benefit manager practices with respect to filling and refilling prescriptions.
<u>SB 626</u>	Health Care Allows additional persons to access information from prescription monitoring program.
<u>SB 627</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Exempts timber from city-owned lands of limited acreage from prohibition against export of unprocessed timber.
<u>SB 628</u>	Business and Transportation Designates portion of U.S. Highway 395, known as Pendleton-John Day Highway, as Don Kendall Memorial Highway.
<u>SB 629</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood Establishes Oregon Right to Rest Act.
<u>SB 630</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides, for purposes of central assessment, that property of company subject to central assessment does not include intangible property.
<u>SB 631</u>	Health Care Establishes Health Care for All Oregon Board to develop, implement and have oversight of Health Care for All Oregon Plan to be administered by Oregon Health Authority.
<u>HB 2047</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Makes adjustments to reserve boundaries in comprehensive planning maps adopted by Metro and previously adjusted by Legislative Assembly.
<u>HB 2173</u>	Judiciary Requires Secretary of State, as State Auditor, to report fraud or other violations of criminal law to appropriate law enforcement agency, regardless of source of moneys involved in fraud or violation.

Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>HB 2227</u>	Judiciary Exempts from definition of "sexual abuse" consensual sexual contact between elderly person and facility employee who is also spouse of elderly person.
<u>HB 2296</u>	Health Care Changes name of Board of Body Art Practitioners to Board of Electrologists and Body Art Practitioners.
<u>HB 2306</u>	Health Care Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to limit providers from which medical assistance recipient may obtain prescription drugs if recipient meets specified criteria.
<u>HB 2327</u>	Judiciary Modifies statutes relating to custodianship of practice of nonperforming attorney.
<u>HB 2328</u>	Judiciary Clarifies that party that is not natural person must appear in court proceedings by attorney unless otherwise specifically provided by law.
<u>HB 2339</u>	Judiciary Requires court to appoint interpreter and provide appropriate assistive communication device when necessary for crime victim who seeks to exercise certain constitutional rights in open court.
<u>HB 2405</u>	Education Allows Department of Education to solicit and accept gifts, grants, donations and other moneys from public and private sources for State School Fund.
<u>HB 2432</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Expands list of lands on which fireworks may be used to repel birds and other animals.
<u>HB 2475</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Authorizes Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board to impose \$100 fine on individual regulated by board who commits administrative or clerical violation that does not create risk of harm to public.
