Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>SB 603</u>	Judiciary Provides that insurer may not offer or issue policy, contract or certificate of insurance that provides that insurer has sole right or right that is superior to right of insured to interpret terms and conditions of policy, contract or certificate or that specifies standard of interpretation or review that is inconsistent with laws of this state.
<u>SB 632</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood;Ways and Means Directs Department of Human Services to establish two pilot programs in rural and urban regions of this state to improve quality and effectiveness of foster care for children and wards placed in legal custody of department for care, placement and supervision.
<u>SB 633</u>	Education Expands Oregon Criminal Justice Commission requirement to create racial and ethnic impact statement to include proposed legislation relating to education policy.
<u>SB 634</u>	Finance and Revenue Eliminates sunset date of homestead property tax deferral program.
<u>SB 635</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that Oregon estate tax is not due unless value of Oregon taxable estate equals or exceeds \$5 million.
<u>SB 636</u>	Judiciary Reduces required age for concealed handgun license applicant to 18 years of age if applicant is servicemember.
<u>SB 637</u>	Finance and Revenue Increases ceiling amount of total assessed value of taxable personal property for purposes of exemption from property taxation.
<u>SB 638</u>	Veterans and Emergency Preparedness Authorizes county governing bodies to appoint county volunteer veterans' ombudsmen to provide support services and assistance to veterans and their spouses, dependents and survivors that are not provided by county veterans' service officers.
<u>SB 639</u>	Judiciary Restricts use of motor vehicle registration plate surveillance cameras.
<u>SB 640</u>	Judiciary Prohibits public body from obtaining location information of electronic device without warrant except in certain circumstances.
<u>SB 641</u>	Judiciary Prohibits public body from obtaining information from portable electronic device without warrant except when imminent threat to public safety exists.
