Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>HB 3058</u>	Workforce Permits certain Public Employee Retirement System members who are retired to be employed by school district or education service district as teachers of career and technical education without loss of retirement benefits.
<u>HB 3093</u>	Judiciary Provides persons licensed to carry concealed handgun in another state with protections provided to persons with Oregon concealed handgun license if other state recognizes Oregon concealed handgun licenses and requires handgun competency to obtain license that is similar to requirement in Oregon.
<u>HB 3143</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood Provides that tax-exempt nonprofit organization may supply to Oregon Liquor Control Commission informational materials about human trafficking, including adhesive stickers, provided that materials contain objectively verifiable information only about human trafficking.
<u>HB 3187</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood Extends terms of office of members of Commission for the Blind.
<u>HB 3222</u>	Human Services and Early Childhood Modifies provisions related to Land Conservation and Development Commission requirement that local government, state agency or special district bring comprehensive plan, land use regulations and limited land use decisions or other land use decisions into compliance with acknowledged plan or regulations upon good cause belief by commission of existence of particular circumstances.
<u>HB 3244</u>	Business and Transportation Provides that borrower or borrower's agent may rely on lender's payoff statement for amount required to discharge mortgage or perform obligation necessary to request reconveyance of estate of real property described in trust deed until after lender delivers amended payoff statement.
<u>HB 3343</u>	Health Care Requires insurers that cover prescription contraceptives to cover refills at specified frequency.
<u>HB 3347</u>	Judiciary Modifies definition of "person with mental illness" as used in civil commitment statutes.
<u>HB 3365</u>	Judiciary Modifies crime of displaying obscene materials to minors.
