<u>SB 201</u>	Human Services Removes requirement that each community developmental disabilities program and support service brokerage have written management plan.
<u>SB 202</u>	Human Services; Ways and Means Directs Department of Human Services to develop and administer voluntary placement program to provide supports to certain young adults as they transition to adulthood.
<u>SB 208</u>	Human Services Grants juvenile court continuing wardship jurisdiction upon establishment of permanent guardianship, regardless of whether original bases for wardship jurisdiction continue to exist.
<u>SB 209</u>	Human Services Requires Department of Human Services to study options for protecting from disclosure in certain proceedings information regarding sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression of children in department's custody.

<u>SB 210</u>	Human Services Requires Department of Human Services to study exceptions to mandatory abuse reporting requirements of department employees who provide assistance to domestic violence victims.

<u>SB 241</u>	Human Services Requires state agency or local government, before providing assistance or benefits to residents of this state who do not have regular access to, or face barriers in attaining, shelter or housing, employment, health care, child care, food, clothing or other basic necessities to fully inform resident of assistance or benefits available from funded federal programs and require resident to apply for or enroll in federal program of assistance or benefits.
<u>SB 300</u>	Human Services Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to engage independent auditor to analyze expenditures from Drug Treatment and Recovery Services Fund for mental health purposes.
<u>SB 305</u>	Judiciary Modifies provisions relating to special motions to strike.
<u>SB 306</u>	Judiciary Modifies statutes to allow for nonattorney associate members of the Oregon State Bar to practice law in certain scope of practice.
<u>SB 307</u>	Judiciary Provides procedure by which party can present offer of judgment in arbitration proceeding.
<u>SB 308</u>	Judiciary Modifies proof of parentage required for intestate succession.
<u>SB 309</u>	Judiciary Modifies number of weeks notice to interested persons in decedent's estate must be published.
<u>SB 310</u>	Judiciary Increases amount of civil penalty Attorney General may obtain for violation of antitrust statutes from \$250,000 to \$1 million.
<u>SB 311</u>	Judiciary Modifies damages and penalties awarded for action for false claims.
<u>SB 312</u>	Judiciary Requires Judicial Department to study allocation of parental decision-making.

<u>SB 313</u>	Judiciary Directs court to take into consideration child's preferences when making best interests determination for purposes of child custody determinations.

<u>SB 315</u>	Judiciary Creates rebuttable presumption that equal parenting time is in best interests of child.
<u>SB 316</u>	Judiciary Makes nonsubstantive and technical changes in Oregon law.
<u>SB 317</u>	Judiciary Provides that requirement that certain hearsay statements of unavailable witnesses concerning acts of abuse must be supported by corroborative evidence applies in juvenile delinquency proceedings.
<u>SB 318</u>	Judiciary Directs Department of Justice to study ways to address organized retail theft, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2023.
<u>SB 319</u>	Judiciary Provides that person who contracts with public body to provide services for purposes of community restoration or to restore fitness to proceed is state officer, employee or agent for purposes of indemnification under Oregon Tort Claims Act under certain circumstances.
<u>SB 320</u>	Judiciary Provides that person sentenced to mandatory minimum sentence under Ballot Measure 11 (1994), for crime other than murder, who has not been previously sentenced under measure is eligible for reduction in sentence for appropriate institutional behavior and participation in certain programming unless otherwise ordered by court for substantial and compelling reasons.
<u>SB 321</u>	Judiciary Creates process by which person convicted or found guilty except for insanity as result of nonunanimous jury verdict may file petition for post-conviction relief within one year of effective date of Act.

<u>SB 542</u>	Energy and Environment Requires original equipment manufacturer to make available to owner of consumer electronic equipment or independent repair provider on fair and reasonable terms any documentation, tool, part or other device or implement that original equipment manufacturer makes available to authorized repair provider for purpose of diagnosing, maintaining or repairing consumer electronic equipment.
<u>SB 543</u>	Energy and Environment Prohibits food vendor from using polystyrene foam container in sales of prepared food.
<u>SB 544</u>	Energy and Environment;Ways and Means Directs Environmental Quality Commission to establish program for source reduction of single-use plastic food ware and single-use packaging and achieve 25 percent source reductions compared to 2023 levels by 2030.
<u>SB 545</u>	Energy and Environment Directs State Department of Agriculture and Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules allowing consumers to use own containers for refilling with food at food establishment.
<u>SB 547</u>	Judiciary Permits court to consider evidence of abuse when determining amount of spousal support.
<u>SB 560</u>	Education Directs State Board of Education to establish rules requiring provision of advocacy services to parents of children with disabilities in relation to public education.
<u>SB 571</u>	Labor and Business Requires employer to offer contribution to ABLE account in lieu of contribution to retirement account.
<u>SB 572</u>	Education;Ways and Means Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to work with Portland State University and community colleges to establish post-secondary program for youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
<u>SB 596</u>	Education;Ways and Means Requires school districts to submit specified information to Department of Education related to talented and gifted children.
<u>SB 609</u>	Human Services Directs Department of Human Services to consider hours worked as graduate assistant as hours worked in employment for purpose of meeting work requirements in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.
