<u>SCR 3</u>	Rules Designates potato as official vegetable of Oregon.

<u>SJR 1</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require two-thirds majority vote in each chamber of Legislative Assembly to pass bills for raising revenue.
<u>SJR 2</u>	Transportation Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to authorize use of motor vehicle-related tax revenue for infrastructure that reduces traffic burden of, or pollution from, motor vehicles on public roads in this state.
<u>SJR 6</u>	Finance and Revenue Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution directing Legislative Assembly to enact property tax relief program for owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors.
<u>SJR 7</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to declare constitutional right to subsist, including right to save and exchange seeds and grow, raise, harvest and consume food of one's own choosing Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.
<u>SJR 8</u>	Finance and Revenue Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution directing Legislative Assembly to enact property tax relief program for owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors.
<u>SJR 9</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing Citizens Redistricting Commission to adopt redistricting maps for Senate, House of Representatives and United States Congress.
<u>SJR 10</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing Citizens Redistricting Commission to adopt redistricting maps for Senate, House of Representatives and United States Congress.
<u>SJR 11</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require approval by majority of Senate of any reprieve, commutation or pardon.
<u>SJR 12</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit holders of appointed offices that require Senate confirmation from holding over beyond conclusion of term of office or four



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	years in office, whichever is less, unless Senate confirms appointed officer for succeeding term of office or succeeding four-year period.
<u>SJR 13</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to vest power of impeachment of statewide elected Executive Branch officials in House of Representatives and power to try impeachments in Senate.
<u>SJR 14</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to place durational and other limitations on declarations of emergency by Governor.
<u>SJR 15</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit expenditure of moneys received by Fund for Student Success for any purpose other than as appropriated in chapter 122, Oregon Laws 2019, or expended for allowable purposes but in different proportion than authorized in chapter 122, Oregon Laws 2019.
<u>SJR 16</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require vote of at least two-thirds of all members elected to each House of Legislative Assembly to pass bills during even-numbered year regular session of Legislative Assembly.
<u>SJR 17</u>	Finance and Revenue Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution directing Legislative Assembly to enact property tax relief program for owner-occupied principal dwellings of certain seniors.
<u>SJR 18</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow Legislative Assembly, by adoption of joint resolution, to repeal administrative rule or amendment of administrative rule adopted by executive branch agency.
<u>SJR 20</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require bills and joint resolutions passed during even-numbered year regular sessions of Legislative Assembly to receive two-thirds vote in favor in each house for passage.
<u>SJR 21</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow Legislative Assembly to require that each administrative rule or amendment of administrative rule adopted by executive branch agency be approved by Legislative Assembly before taking effect.
<u>SJR 22</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to limit increase in state governmental appropriations for general governmental purposes in biennium to least of percentage increase in projected personal income, percentage increase in projected population growth plus inflation or percentage increase in projected gross domestic product of Oregon for biennium.
<u>SJR 24</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to eliminate even-numbered year regular sessions of Legislative Assembly.



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<u>SJR 25</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing independent redistricting commission to adopt redistricting maps for Senate, House of Representatives and United States Congress.
<u>SB 11</u>	Rules Requires state boards or commissions that conduct public meetings through electronic means to record and promptly publish recording on website or hosting service so that public may observe or listen to meetings free of charge.
<u>SB 12</u>	Health Care Changes term "naloxone" to "opioid antagonist."
<u>SB 14</u>	Transportation Requires Department of Transportation to study options for expanding passenger rail service in Oregon.
<u>SB 16</u>	Transportation Requires Department of Transportation to study funding options to support transportation by rail.
<u>SB 18</u>	Judiciary Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study best practices for private security training.
<u>SB 19</u>	Judiciary Prohibits peace officer, school resource officer or special campus security officer from conducting custodial interview with person under 18 years of age unless person has consulted with attorney.
<u>SB 21</u>	Judiciary Permits limited liability companies in operating agreement to establish or provide for establishing one or more designated series of members, managers, transferable interests or assets.
<u>SB 22</u>	Rules Requires that declarations and extensions of states of emergency under certain statutes be accompanied by written explanations.
<u>SB 24</u>	Rules Provides that legislative department may not call on state police to enforce criminal laws or regulations of department.
<u>SB 27</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to conduct study and analyze provisions of Oregon Constitution, Oregon Revised Statutes and Oregon Administrative Rules relating to voter access.
<u>SB 28</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to conduct study and develop recommendations regarding most effective methods for improving candidate inclusion in voters' pamphlet and efficacy of voters' pamphlet.



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SB 29	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how to improve transparency and accountability in conduct of campaigns by candidates for elected public office.
SB 36	Labor and Business Authorizes Director of Employment Department to study alternative arrangements by which employers may make tax payments required under unemployment insurance law.
SB 38	Rules Requires certain agencies to apply rules applicable to certain permit application in effect on date complete permit application is received, or on date 60 days after permit application is received if agency does not notify applicant of deficiencies in application.
SB 39	Rules Requires agency to report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly before permanently amending rule that was adopted or last amended less than five years earlier.
SB 40	Rules Requires agency to provide technical and legal documentation supporting statement of need required in notice of rulemaking.
SB 41	Rules Creates Task Force on Regulatory Efficiency.
SB 42	Rules;Ways and Means Modifies provisions relating to fiscal impact statements for administrative rules.
SB 43	Rules Requires agencies to post certain information about rulemaking on agency websites.
SB 44	Labor and Business;Ways and Means Establishes office of business ombudsman in Oregon Department of Administrative Services.
SB 53	Rules Adds members of household of candidate to list of persons who may not be employed to open ballot envelopes, handle ballots, prepare ballots for counting or count ballots.
SB 62	Judiciary Provides that recipients of grants through universal representation program may not prioritize legal services to individuals who are detained or at imminent risk of deportation because they committed crimes.
SB 73	Judiciary Modifies definition of "person with mental illness" as used in civil commitment statutes.
SB 74	Judiciary;Ways and Means Establishes Department of the Oregon Public Safety Reserve Force to employ retired law enforcement officers and corrections officers and law enforcement officers and corrections officers from other states to serve in reserve force for local law enforcement units and Department of Corrections.



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<u>SB 75</u>	Judiciary Establishes civil action against surety for victim injured by felony defendant while on security release.
<u>SB 76</u>	Rules;Ways and Means Directs State Parks and Recreation Department to develop and implement grant program to fund capital projects of history museums.
<u>SB 120</u>	Ways and Means Establishes that Oregon Labor Monument is to be built in State Capital State Park.
<u>SB 296</u>	Judiciary Increases criminal and civil penalties for subsequent and intentional violations of specified election laws.
<u>SB 527</u>	Judiciary Allows gun dealer or person transferring firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition or ammunition components for purchase at gun show, or business engaged in repairing or servicing firearms to establish minimum age of 21 years for such purchases, repairs or services.
<u>SB 528</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Modifies provisions relating to protective proceedings.
<u>SB 529</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Modifies legislative findings concerning alternative incarceration programs.
<u>SB 532</u>	Judiciary Permits member of cooperative to rescind contract with cooperative if member relies on information about financial condition of cooperative that cooperative, or director or officer of cooperative, provides and member later discovers that cooperative, or director or officer of cooperative, concealed material information, provided inaccurate, misleading or false information or otherwise acted to deceive member.
<u>SB 536</u>	Judiciary Establishes best interest standard for recommendations or sales of annuities to prospective purchasers.
<u>SB 539</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study and develop recommendations for classification system for traumatic brain injuries and training for first responders and law enforcement in identifying symptoms of traumatic brain injuries, acquired brain injuries and post-traumatic stress syndrome and training on appropriate referrals for services and treatment.
<u>SB 554</u>	Judiciary Creates process by which person may file post-conviction relief petition due to currently available relevant forensic scientific evidence at any time after conviction.
<u>SB 558</u>	Health Care Exempts from regulation by Advisory Council on Hearing Aids and Health Licensing Office over-the-counter hearing aid.



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<u>SB 559</u>	Health Care Requires veterinarians to participate in prescription drug monitoring program.
<u>SB 562</u>	Judiciary Creates procedure by which attorney of in-custody defendant may request prosecuting attorney to make expedited determination of whether to file motion for protective order for grand jury audio recording or notes or report of shorthand reporter and, if no motion is filed, immediately provide copy of transcript, notes or report to defense attorney.
<u>SB 563</u>	Judiciary Expands crime of assault in the third degree to include causing physical injury to person working in hospital while worker is performing official duties.
<u>SB 565</u>	Health Care Requires insurer, pharmacy benefit manager, Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and health care service contractor to count payments made by or on behalf of enrollee for costs of certain prescription drugs when calculating enrollee's contribution to out-of-pocket maximum, deductible, copayment, coinsurance or other cost-sharing for drugs.
<u>SB 566</u>	Judiciary Provides that lack of verbal or physical resistance does not by itself constitute lack of consent or inability to consent in determination of whether sexual act is consensual.
<u>SB 567</u>	Judiciary Modifies definition of "sexual contact" for purposes of Oregon Criminal Code.
<u>SB 568</u>	Judiciary Provides that court is not required to hold hearing on petition to vacate defendant's requirement to install and use ignition interlock device while participating in diversion program.
<u>SB 577</u>	Judiciary Modifies when use of force upon minor child or student is justifiable and not criminal.
<u>SB 598</u>	Transportation Transfers jurisdiction of Southeast Powell Boulevard to City of Portland.
<u>SB 605</u>	Judiciary Creates affirmative defense to crimes involving visual depiction or visual recording of sexually explicit conduct involving child when defendant and child are within specified age range and certain other circumstances exist.
<u>SB 607</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to study membership of Pain Management Commission.
<u>SB 608</u>	Health Care Prohibits insurers offering policies or certificates of health insurance and pharmacy benefit managers from requiring claim for reimbursement of prescription drug to include modifier or other indicator that drug is 340B drug.



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<u>SB 612</u>	Rules;Ways and Means Establishes Indigenous Language Justice Fund.
<u>SB 614</u>	Judiciary Establishes exception, for video cameras worn by law enforcement officer, to prohibition on law enforcement agency collecting or maintaining information about person's political, religious or social views or activities.
<u>SB 615</u>	Judiciary Modifies crime of organizing speed racing event.
<u>SB 618</u>	Judiciary Establishes procedure for charging aggravated version of offense when defendant commits felony while wearing body armor.
<u>SB 619</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Permits consumers to obtain from a controller that processes consumer personal data confirmation as to whether controller is processing consumer's personal data and categories of personal data controller is processing, list of specific third parties to which controller has disclosed consumer's personal data and copy of all of consumer's personal data that controller has processed or is processing.
<u>SB 689</u>	Judiciary Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to create pilot grant program funding coalitions that create nonpolice response systems to minor instances of crime.
<u>SB 690</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Creates Community Escrow Fund in State Treasury to hold coordinated care organization restricted reserves.
<u>SB 695</u>	Human Services;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Health Authority to study potential pathways for local governments and nonprofit providers to receive Medicaid reimbursement directly for crisis response services.
<u>SB 697</u>	Judiciary Modifies process for setting aside convictions and guilty except for insanity judgments.
<u>SB 698</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Directs Judicial Department to develop and implement automated system that identifies convictions, arrests, citations, charges and judgments of guilty except for insanity that are eligible to be automatically sealed.
<u>SB 699</u>	Judiciary Expands definition of "public safety officer" to include certain regulatory specialists as persons who may be eligible for benefit awards from Public Safety Memorial Fund.
<u>SB 700</u>	Judiciary Exempts from crime of unlawfully obtaining or attempting to obtain conversation recording of conversation occurring in public place using unconcealed recording device.
<u>SB 701</u>	Judiciary Requires Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish statewide online database of certain information about public safety employees.



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<u>SB 703</u>	Health Care Requires passage of specified examination for certification as nursing assistant.
<u>SB 704</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Establishes Universal Health Plan Governance Board and directs board to create comprehensive plan for implementing Universal Health Plan beginning in 2027.
<u>SB 705</u>	Judiciary Authorizes self-service dispensing of Class 1 flammable liquids at retail dispensary.
<u>SB 711</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Requires licensed health care provider to provide vaccine information packet to patient to whom licensed health care provider administers vaccine.
<u>SB 716</u>	Health Care Allows health care practitioner to prescribe or dispense drug for off-label indication.
<u>SB 717</u>	Health Care Establishes that decisions related to immunizations are personal health care decisions and that immunizations may not be mandated as condition of employment for registered nurses or other medical staff unless required by federal law.
<u>SB 723</u>	Rules Requires agency, upon written request of 10 members of Legislative Assembly objecting to rule, to appear before appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly for hearing on rule.
<u>SB 725</u>	Rules Requires ballots returned by mail to be received by date of election.
<u>SB 727</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Directs Department of State Police to maintain staffing level of at least 20 patrol troopers per 100,000 residents of this state, beginning January 1, 2034.
<u>SB 729</u>	Judiciary Modifies exemptions from liability related to sale or successful solicitation of sale of security in violation of securities law.
<u>SB 730</u>	Rules Declares policy of state to use zero-based budgeting in developing biennial budget plan.
<u>SB 732</u>	Rules Modifies existing administrative rule review process to require legislative approval of newly adopted administrative rules in order for rules to take effect.
<u>SB 735</u>	Judiciary Restores offense levels for unlawful possession of controlled substance offenses to levels that existed prior to enactment of House Bill 2355 (2017) and Drug Addiction Treatment and Recovery Act of 2020 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020)).
