SCR 1	Rules Expresses support for county clerks and local election officials.
SJM 3	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Urges President, United States Secretary of the Interior and United States Secretary of Agriculture to direct federal agencies to be as aggressive as possible in preventing, mitigating and suppressing wildfires on federal lands.
SJR 3	Judiciary;Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing right to carry concealed firearms.
SJR 4	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to eliminate even-numbered year regular sessions of Legislative Assembly.
SJR 5	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require two-thirds majority vote in favor in each chamber of Legislative Assembly to pass bills declaring emergency.
SJR 23	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Urges State Forestry Department, Department of the State Fire Marshal, Oregon Department of Emergency Management and local rural fire protection districts and fire departments to be as aggressive as possible in preventing, mitigating and suppressing wildfires in this state.
SB 54	Energy and Environment;Tax Expenditures Removes provisions of property tax exemption for community solar projects that restrict exemption to proportion owned by residential customers or leased by residential subscribers.
SB 59	Natural Resources;Tax Expenditures Increases maximum allowed amount of natural resource property credit against estate tax and maximum value of total adjusted gross estate eligible to claim credit.
SB 64	Energy and Environment Requires Department of Environmental Quality to study disposal of electric vehicle batteries and batteries used to store energy in wind or solar renewable energy facilities.
SB 65	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to establish program to purchase aquaculture products from private aquaculture facilities.
SB 167	Rules Alters dates by which special district recall petitions must be filed and verified.
SB 168	Rules Expressly prohibits public employees, while on job during working hours or while otherwise working in official capacity, from promoting or opposing appointment, nomination or election of public officials.
SB 169	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how to improve efficacy of voters' pamphlet.

<u>SB 170</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how best to improve Oregon's campaign finance system.
<u>SB 172</u>	Natural Resources Requires Sustainability Board to study methods for attaining sustainability.
<u>SB 173</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how to best improve process for conducting state legislative and congressional reapportionment in this state.
<u>SB 174</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how to best integrate precinct committee persons into elections conducted by state.
<u>SB 175</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study how to best ensure quick tallying and security of ballots following elections.
<u>SB 176</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study whether election calendar should be altered in order to ensure greatest possible level of voter participation.
<u>SB 177</u>	Rules Requires state agencies to produce materials relevant to audits conducted by Secretary of State.
<u>SB 178</u>	Rules Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to study and make recommendations for policy proposals for tax treatment of military pensions.
<u>SB 179</u>	Rules Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to study and make recommendations regarding improvements to operations of department.
<u>SB 180</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Directs Oregon Department of Emergency Management to study and make recommendations regarding improvements to operations of department.
<u>SB 181</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs; Tax Expenditures Exempts from state income tax military pay received by Oregon National Guard member while in active service of state or on state active duty.
<u>SB 182</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Directs Oregon Military Department to study and make recommendations regarding improvements to operations of department.
<u>SB 184</u>	Labor and Business Modifies employer child support reporting requirements to include payments made to independent contractors.
<u>SB 185</u>	Judiciary Requires Department of Justice to study immigration in this state.

<u>SB 186</u>	Human Services Increases amount of monthly child support passed through to families participating in temporary assistance for needy families program.
<u>SB 187</u>	Labor and Business Repeals provision that prohibits transit workers from striking.
<u>SB 188</u>	Judiciary Repeals provision prohibiting court from excluding admissible evidence on grounds evidence was obtained in violation of statute except in specified circumstances.
<u>SB 189</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to health care in Oregon.
<u>SB 190</u>	Health Care Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study factors contributing to cost of health insurance premiums.
<u>SB 191</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to study fee-for-service medical assistance recipients' access to health care providers in rural areas of this state.
<u>SB 192</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to study ways to lower cost of prescription drugs.
<u>SB 194</u>	Labor and Business Makes permanent provision excluding certain employees of Oregon State Police from meaning of supervisory employee for purposes of public employment.
<u>SB 195</u>	Labor and Business Excludes hours of overtime worked for Oregon State Police from limitations on inclusion of overtime in final average salary for purposes of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan.
<u>SB 196</u>	Judiciary Requires business that provides online product, service or feature that child is reasonably likely to access to identify, evaluate and mitigate risks to child from online product, service or feature.
<u>SB 198</u>	Finance and Revenue Clarifies distinction between commercial and residential floating structures for purposes of personal property tax return requirement.
<u>SB 200</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs; Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Salvage Chief (LSM380) Foundation for purpose of repairing and upgrading salvage vessel.
<u>SB 211</u>	Judiciary Repeals sunset on requirement for Department of Corrections to provide training for basic certification of corrections officers employed by department.
<u>SB 212</u>	Judiciary Makes confidential and exempts from discovery and public records certain communications and information conveyed during peer support check-in sessions with Oregon Youth

<u>SB 213</u>	Labor and Business
	Updates reporting requirements for worker leasing companies providing workers' compensation coverage to client employers.
<u>SB 214</u>	Labor and Business
	Conforms definition of "average weekly wage" as used in death benefits section to definition used generally in ORS chapter 656.
<u>SB 216</u>	Health Care
	Prohibits disclosure of individually identifiable data collected in accordance with uniform standards adopted by Oregon Health Authority for collection of data on race, ethnicity, preferred spoken and written languages, disability status, sexual orientation and gender identity.
<u>SB 244</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs
	Limits interest rate to no more than prime rate plus one percent for loans advanced under veterans' home and farm loan program.
<u>SB 245</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs
	Requires Adjutant General to grant militia member's request for exemption to immunization requirements because of member's religious beliefs.
<u>SB 246</u>	Education
	Removes requirement that menstrual products be provided in public charter schools and in bathrooms designated for males.
<u>SB 247</u>	Natural Resources
	Undoes provisions adopted in Senate Bill 762 (2021).
<u>SB 249</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs
	Provides that, when interview is element of process of selecting candidate for civil service position from eligibility list, public employer must interview each veteran applicant who meets qualifications for position and shows transferable skills if duties of position are performed by only one person within public employer's organization.
<u>SB 250</u>	Rules
	Directs Secretary of State to establish and maintain searchable and publicly accessible database containing copy of every ballot cast in each election.
<u>SB 251</u>	Energy and Environment; Tax Expenditures
	Creates income tax credit for energy production in Oregon.
<u>SB 252</u>	Education
	Requires each school district, education service district and public charter school to ensure that state moneys received by district or school are used to educate student for which moneys are received.
<u>SB 254</u>	Judiciary
	Repeals those provisions of Drug Addiction Treatment and Recovery Act of 2020 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020)) that pertain to decriminalization of possession of drugs.

<u>SB 256</u>	Judiciary Prohibits person from knowingly or intentionally manufacturing, importing, distributing, offering for sale, selling or leasing or otherwise transferring, or installing or reinstalling counterfeit automobile supplemental restraint system component, nonfunctional airbag or object that does not comply with federal standard for make, model and year of motor vehicle.
<u>SB 257</u>	Judiciary Requires person that provides public access to pornography to verify that resident individual is 18 years of age or older before granting access.
<u>SB 258</u>	Rules Establishes \$100 limit on campaign contributions that may be accepted by candidates.
<u>SB 295</u>	Education Creates crime of patronizing a trafficked child.
<u>SB 299</u>	Rules Removes requirement that only elector who has personally printed copy, or requested that separate person print copy, of electronic signature sheet for petition or prospective petition may sign signature sheet.
<u>SB 301</u>	Judiciary Provides that person operating bicycle may not treat stop signs and flashing red lights as yield signs if bicyclist slows bicycle to safe speed.
<u>SB 303</u>	Health Care Directs Oregon Health Authority to require psilocybin service centers and psilocybin service facilitators licensed by authority to collect and report specified data.
<u>SB 304</u>	Labor and Business;Ways and Means Establishes Task Force on Occupational Licensing.
<u>SB 471</u>	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Department of Agriculture for deposit in Wolf Management Compensation and Proactive Trust Fund.
<u>SB 479</u>	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Directs State Department of Agriculture to adopt rules allowing donation of meat to charitable organizations and other organizations that offer food for noncommercial purposes.
<u>SB 480</u>	Natural Resources Prohibits director of agricultural cooperative, with respect to financial condition of agricultural cooperative, from intentionally or negligently concealing material information from member of agricultural cooperative, providing inaccurate or misleading material information to member of agricultural cooperative or otherwise acting to deceive member of agricultural cooperative.
<u>SB 488</u>	Energy and Environment Requires municipal solid waste incinerator that accepts more than specified amounts of hospital, medical or infectious waste in calendar year to meet federal emissions limits for hospital, medical or infectious waste incinerator.

<u>SB 494</u>	Energy and Environment Directs Department of Environmental Quality to conduct long-term study of cumulative impacts of air contaminants in areas surrounding municipal solid waste incinerators.
<u>SB 502</u>	Natural Resources Requires State Forestry Department to study establishment of permanent trust fund for wildfire programs.
<u>SB 505</u>	Natural Resources Requires State Forestry Department to study local government discretion concerning regulation of wildfire risk.
<u>SB 507</u>	Natural Resources Makes certain changes to farm direct marketing law.
<u>SB 509</u>	Natural Resources Requires State Forestry Department to study community-based programs for reducing wildfire risk.
<u>SB 546</u>	Energy and Environment Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt and maintain list of designated high priority chemicals of concern used in cosmetic products and to periodically review and revise list.
<u>SB 582</u>	Energy and Environment; Ways and Means Requires state agency that authorizes or funds, in whole or in part, installation of electric vehicle charging system located on customer's side of meter to require installing contractor or contractors to hold all legally required licenses and one or more electricians who hold Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program certification to supervise or participate in installation.
<u>SB 588</u>	Energy and Environment Directs Department of State Lands, in collaboration with State Marine Board, Department of Environmental Quality, Oregon State Police, Oregon State Sheriffs' Association and representative of local agency that delivers social services, to study issues related to removal and disposal of abandoned and derelict marine vessels in this state and to report results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to natural resources no later than September 15, 2024.
<u>SB 617</u>	Natural Resources; Ways and Means Instructs Director of Agriculture to employ organic policy special assistant to director.
<u>SB 634</u>	Natural Resources; Ways and Means Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for deposit in Levee Project Grant Fund.
<u>SB 643</u>	Natural Resources Modifies provisions relating to sales of homemade foods.
<u>SB 644</u>	Natural Resources Removes certain requirements relating to wildfire risk maps for development of accessory dwelling units on lands zoned for rural residential use.

<u>SB 648</u>	Housing and Development Prohibits counties from allowing use of certain new dwellings on resource lands as vacation occupancies.
<u>SB 676</u>	Energy and Environment Removes requirement that adequate repository for terminal disposition of high-level radioactive waste be licensed as precondition for issuance of site certificate for nuclear-fueled thermal power plant.
<u>SB 678</u>	Energy and Environment Establishes state policy that benefits from offshore wind energy development go to local and regional communities, ecosystems and environments and economies and that interconnection of offshore energy projects be carried out in manner that promotes electric grid reliability and resilience.
<u>SB 679</u>	Natural Resources; Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Parks and Recreation Department for continued development of Oregon Coast Trail.
<u>SB 681</u>	Energy and Environment Requires Public Utility Commission to study rate impacts associated with implementing reduction of greenhouse gas emissions required by House Bill 2021 (2021).
<u>SB 682</u>	Natural Resources Allows recreational vehicle used to provide security of farm use to be sited on lands zoned for exclusive farm use.
<u>SB 691</u>	Energy and Environment Requires Water Resources Department to study legal implications of recent Oregon Supreme Court case for water rights of certain hydroelectric projects.
<u>SB 712</u>	Health Care Adds vaccines to definition of "children's product" for purposes of Toxic-Free Kids Act.
<u>SB 718</u>	Natural Resources Provides that year in which Governor declares that drought exists, or is likely to exist, within county does not count toward period of time for forfeiture of water right for nonuse for owner of water right within county.
<u>SB 721</u>	Energy and Environment Removes prohibition on Energy Facility Siting Council issuing site certificate for new generating facility that would produce energy from natural gas and emit greenhouse gas.
<u>SB 724</u>	Energy and Environment Declares that policy of state is to include atmospheric carbon sequestered by lands and waters of state in calculation to determine progress towards greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals.
