Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>SB 237</u>	Judiciary Provides that Department of State Police has exclusive jurisdiction to investigate certain incidents involving police officers and corrections officers.
<u>SB 240</u>	Judiciary Requires law enforcement agencies to collect blood or buccal sample of arrested persons and submit sample to Department of State Police within 96 hours of collection.
<u>SB 298</u>	Labor and Business Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to contract with private auditing firm not located in this state to conduct audit of all nonprofit organizations that since January 1, 2019, received moneys paid, directly or indirectly or through state agency or otherwise, from State Treasury.
<u>SB 302</u>	Health Care Requires applicant for license to manufacture psilocybin to submit to Oregon Health Authority information regarding ownership and location of premises to be licensed.
<u>SB 327</u>	Judiciary Provides that district attorneys and deputy district attorneys qualify as police officers under Public Employees Retirement System.
<u>SB 401</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to study tardive dyskinesia.
<u>SB 403</u>	Labor and Business Allows person who retires from Department of State Police as police officer to participate in group benefit plan offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board with no increase in premiums.
<u>SB 404</u>	Health Care Requires State Board of Pharmacy to study prescription drugs.
<u>SB 405</u>	Energy and Environment Prohibits sale of new clothes washers unless washers are equipped with built-in or in-line microfiber filtration system.
<u>SB 406</u>	Housing and Development Requires certain cities in Tillamook County to allow middle housing on residentially zoned lands, to adopt housing production strategies and to accommodate estimated housing needs upon lands inventoried as buildable lands.
<u>SB 408</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish process to receive and review health care profession scope of practice requests and impact statements.
<u>SB 410</u>	Health Care Allows State Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules to issue temporary license to perform duties of pharmacy technician.
<u>SB 411</u>	Health Care Adds certain hospital, medical and infectious waste incinerators to facilities at which covered drugs under drug takeback program may be disposed of.

<u>SB 412</u>	Health Care Requires dental laboratory to register with Health Licensing Office.
<u>SB 413</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Establishes Public Defense Services Student Loan Repayment Assistance Program in Oregon State Bar to provide forgivable loans to eligible public defense attorneys for outstanding student loans.
<u>SB 417</u>	Rules Directs public bodies to perform search, review and duplication work in responding to public records requests in least expensive manner reasonably possible.
<u>SB 418</u>	Labor and Business Requires subject employers to adopt policy allowing subject workers paid time off during shift to receive medical services related to worker's compensable injury or occupational disease.
<u>SB 419</u>	Human Services;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Department of Human Services for Hunger Task Force to support state's policy on hunger.
<u>SB 422</u>	Judiciary Allows motorcycle operator to travel between lanes of traffic under certain conditions.
<u>SB 428</u>	Labor and Business Modifies pay equity requirements for employers.
<u>SB 429</u>	Natural Resources Establishes certain requirements for member of board of directors of agricultural cooperative.
<u>SB 430</u>	Judiciary Establishes procedure for charging aggravated version of certain assault and attempted murder offenses when defendant causes permanent physical injury to victim during commission of crime.
<u>SB 431</u>	The Interstate 5 Bridge;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for distribution to Port of Hood River for construction of Hood River-White Salmon Interstate Bridge.
<u>SB 432</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Health Authority to develop, implement and administer program to support consumer engagement efforts aimed at increasing and optimizing consumer involvement in planning and decision-making surrounding the access to, and the delivery of, behavioral health services in this state.
<u>SB 440</u>	Energy and Environment;Ways and Means Directs Department of Transportation to establish intensive planting pilot program to plant trees and vegetation in highway right of way for purpose of sequestering carbon.
<u>SB 441</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Creates dental care provider incentive grant program within Oregon Health Authority to increase recruitment and retention of dental care providers.



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<u>SB 442</u>	Labor and Business Permits contracting agency to grant preference to procuring for public use goods that are fabricated or processed, or services that are performed, entirely within this state if goods or services cost not more than five percent more than goods not processed or fabricated, or services not performed, entirely within this state if contracting agency can reasonably and credibly determine that procuring at higher price offsets environmental costs of transporting goods or service providers from outside this state.
<u>SB 443</u>	Energy and Environment Requires electric companies to reimburse qualified customers up to \$250 for purchase price of backup power source when power shutoff is likely to occur and power shutoff will likely last for eight or more hours.
<u>SB 444</u>	Energy and Environment;Ways and Means Directs Department of Environmental Quality to establish Recycling Innovators Grant Program.
<u>SB 445</u>	Transportation;Ways and Means Establishes Rural Traffic Safety Grant Fund to provide grants to rural cities for installation and improvement of traffic control devices and crosswalks.
<u>SB 446</u>	Finance and Revenue;Ways and Means Establishes refundable personal income tax credit of \$1,000 per qualifying child.
<u>SB 447</u>	Finance and Revenue Allows personal income taxpayer to subtract from taxable income amounts paid as interest on qualified education loans, if income does not exceed threshold amount.
<u>SB 448</u>	Labor and Business Repeals provisions requiring employers to pay overtime to agricultural workers who work in excess of maximum allowable hours.
<u>SB 450</u>	Health Care Exempts from labeling requirements drug intended to reverse opioid overdose when drug is dispensed by physician or physician assistant.
<u>SB 451</u>	Finance and Revenue Removes annual limit of \$1.53 million, adjusted for inflation, on allocations from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to County Fair Account.
<u>SB 452</u>	Finance and Revenue Prohibits physicians from performing irreversible gender reassignment surgery on minor.
<u>SB 454</u>	Finance and Revenue Allows exclusion from taxable estate for value of interest in family-owned business.
<u>SB 456</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that Oregon estate tax is imposed only on estates of decedents dying on or before December 31, 2022.
<u>SB 457</u>	Labor and Business;Ways and Means Directs Employment Department to develop Agricultural Worker Overtime Relief Payment Program to provide eligible agricultural workers with payments for hours worked beyond 40



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	hours but not exceeding 48 hours per workweek.
<u>SB 460</u>	Rules;Ways and Means Directs Department of Revenue to make one-time transfer of funds to cities and counties in this state.
<u>SB 461</u>	Ways and Means Directs Oregon Business Development Department to develop and implement program to grant additional funding for certain capital construction projects affected by inflation or disruptions related to COVID-19 pandemic.
<u>SB 462</u>	Judiciary Authorizes law enforcement agency to release booking photo upon second or subsequent arrest of person depicted in photo within 12-month period, or when person depicted in photo is missing person.
<u>SB 463</u>	Health Care Prohibits health benefit plans from imposing prior authorization or other utilization review requirements on coverage of proton beam therapy that do not apply to coverage of radiation therapy.
<u>SB 464</u>	Rules Renames Public Service Building to Dennis Richardson Public Service Building.
<u>SB 465</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that property of company that is organized and located outside of this state and exclusively operates jet boat excursion business on boundary rivers of this state and not on rivers within this state is not subject to central assessment for purposes of property taxation.
<u>SB 467</u>	Judiciary Establishes mandatory minimum sentence of 48 months' imprisonment for assault committed by correctional facility inmate against corrections officer.
<u>SB 468</u>	Labor and Business Changes minimum contract price at which prevailing rate of wage applies to public works projects from \$50,000 to amount that Oregon Department of Administrative Services determines by rule.
<u>SB 469</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Establishes Indian Health Scholarship Program to provide free tuition and fees for qualifying Indian health profession students in exchange for student commitment to work at tribal service site after graduation.
<u>SB 470</u>	Judiciary Prohibits denial of medical assistance on basis that individual under 19 years of age is in detention pending adjudication.
<u>SB 472</u>	Judiciary Provides that county is exempt from applicability of statute banning use of dogs to hunt or pursue cougars if voters approve county measure proposed by initiative petition or referred to people by governing body of county.



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<u>SB 474</u>	Judiciary Directs Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force to study ways of preventing disclosure of personal medical information of sexual assault victims and report results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2024.
<u>SB 475</u>	Judiciary Creates crime of unlawful disclosure of information about victim of sexual assault or sex trafficking.
<u>SB 476</u>	Health Care Repeals provisions authorizing Oregon Health Authority to review material change transactions proposed between health care entities.
<u>SB 477</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Directs Department of Revenue to make one-time transfer of funds to cities and counties in this state.
<u>SB 478</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Provides that portion of Oregon Highway 82 shall be known as Deputy Raymond Williams and Deputy Michael Cheney Memorial Highway.
<u>SB 481</u>	Labor and Business Modifies requirements for employee to be eligible to take unpaid family and medical leave.
<u>SB 483</u>	Judiciary Allows operator offering or providing facilities for inherently dangerous sporting activity to require patron to provide anticipatory release from certain claims for liability, including claims arising out of negligence of operator and claims for unreasonable conditions created by operator.
<u>SB 484</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Health Authority to administer program to offer financial incentives to increase number of nurses in Oregon including by paying stipends to hospitals that provide clinical training opportunities to nurses.
<u>SB 485</u>	Health Care Extends health care provider incentive program to health care providers who are students enrolled in health professional training programs leading to licensure as licensed practical nurse or registered nurse.
<u>SB 486</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organization to pay reasonable per diem rate for patient whose discharge from hospital is delayed due to circumstances beyond hospital's control.
<u>SB 487</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish grant program to provide financial support to certified dental sealant programs that promote and engage in oral health care coordination activities.
<u>SB 490</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Directs Oregon Medical Board to support alliance program for family medicine residency training programs in this state.

<u>SB 491</u>	Health Care Requires health insurance coverage of specified fertility services and treatments with exemption for certain insurers.
<u>SB 492</u>	Health Care Imposes new requirements on the determination of health services to be provided in state medical assistance program.
<u>SB 495</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules for licensing urgent care centers and specifies requirements.
<u>SB 497</u>	Health Care Requires state medical assistance program and health insurance policies and certificates to cover computerized tomography coronary calcium score scans.
<u>SB 498</u>	Finance and Revenue Allows exclusion from taxable estate for value of interest in farm, forestry or fishing business.
<u>SB 499</u>	Rules Changes date of certain elections in presidential years from third Tuesday in May to first Tuesday in March.
<u>SB 500</u>	Rules Prohibits candidates for state office from accepting contributions in excess of amounts specified and from sources not specified.
<u>SB 501</u>	Rules;Ways and Means Establishes Bank of the State of Oregon.
<u>SB 503</u>	Housing and Development Requires Real Estate Agency to study homeowners associations.
<u>SB 506</u>	Rules Permits counties to adopt ranked-choice voting to conduct county elections.
<u>SB 508</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study requirements for publication of legal notices.
<u>SB 510</u>	Rules Directs Public Records Advocate to estimate biennial costs to carry out duties of advocate and to allocate and assess costs among public bodies of state government.
<u>SB 511</u>	Health Care Requires licensed health care provider to provide vaccine information packet to patient to whom licensed health care provider administers vaccine.
<u>SB 512</u>	Transportation Requires that fee for motor vehicle emission certificates of compliance issued after inspection that did not occur at department test station and did not use testing equipment owned by department not exceed lowest fee for other motor vehicle emissions certificates of compliance.

<u>SB 513</u>	Health Care Prohibits abortion unless health care provider first determines probable gestational age of unborn child, except in case of medical emergency.
<u>SB 515</u>	Finance and Revenue Exempts from state income tax retirement pay or pension received as result of service in Armed Forces of the United States.
<u>SB 519</u>	Judiciary Modifies procedure for expunction of certain juvenile records.
<u>SB 520</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Establishes Medical Release Advisory Committee within State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.
<u>SB 524</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to convene advisory council to consider policy implications of identifying specific crimes for which conviction is disqualifying conviction for individuals seeking licensure or registration from Teacher Standards and Practices Commission or seeking employment or contract with school district.
<u>SB 533</u>	Finance and Revenue Creates Oregon tax subtraction for interest received by financial institutions from loans made for purchase or improvement of agricultural real estate, rural residences and coastal fishing boats.
<u>SB 534</u>	Housing and Development;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Facilities Authority to provide financing for infrastructure and predevelopment costs for moderate income housing.
<u>SB 535</u>	Labor and Business;Tax Expenditures Creates refundable income tax credit for certain child care workers.
<u>SB 537</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset for shared services distributions.
<u>SB 564</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to be used for regional health equity coalitions.
<u>SB 579</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Allows persons convicted of felony to register to vote, update voter registration and vote in elections while incarcerated.
<u>SB 581</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Requires Department of Corrections to adopt rules requiring supervising officers to provide to eligible persons on supervision quarterly updates on progress toward earning reduction in supervision.
<u>SB 584</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Directs Oregon Health Authority to implement website with functionality to provide online scheduling portal for health care providers that participate in medical assistance to use to contact health care interpreters directly and to process billing.



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<u>SB 585</u>	Rules Allows otherwise qualified person who becomes United States citizen less than 180 days before date of primary election to file for and be elected to office of precinct committee person, if person registers as member of major political party by filing deadline.
<u>SB 586</u>	Judiciary Makes restorative justice communications confidential.
<u>SB 589</u>	Judiciary Increases age of declarant for which certain statements related to abuse are not excluded from evidence as hearsay from under 12 years of age to under 18 years of age.
