SB 237	Judiciary
SB 240	Provides that Department of State Police has exclusive jurisdiction to investigate certain incidents involving police officers and corrections officers. Judiciary
SB 298	Requires law enforcement agencies to collect blood or buccal sample of arrested persons and submit sample to Department of State Police within 96 hours of collection. Labor and Business
SB 302	Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to contract with private auditing firm not located in this state to conduct audit of all nonprofit organizations that since January 1, 2019, received moneys paid, directly or indirectly or through state agency or otherwise, from State Treasury. Health Care
SB 327	Requires applicant for license to manufacture psilocybin to submit to Oregon Health Authority information regarding ownership and location of premises to be licensed. <b>Judiciary</b>
SB 401	Provides that district attorneys and deputy district attorneys qualify as police officers under Public Employees Retirement System. <b>Health Care</b>
	Requires Oregon Health Authority to study tardive dyskinesia.
SB 403	Labor and Business
SB 404	Allows person who retires from Department of State Police as police officer to participate in group benefit plan offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board with no increase in premiums. Health Care
	Requires State Board of Pharmacy to study prescription drugs.
SB 405	Energy and Environment
SB 406	Prohibits sale of new clothes washers unless washers are equipped with built-in or in-line microfiber filtration system. Housing and Development
SB 408	Requires certain cities in Tillamook County to allow middle housing on residentially zoned lands, to adopt housing production strategies and to accommodate estimated housing needs upon lands inventoried as buildable lands. Health Care; Ways and Means
SB 410	Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish process to receive and review health care profession scope of practice requests and impact statements. Health Care
SB 411	Allows State Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules to issue temporary license to perform duties of pharmacy technician. Health Care
	Adds certain hospital, medical and infectious waste incinerators to facilities at which covered drugs under drug takeback program may be disposed of.

SB 417	Establishes Public Defense Services Student Loan Repayment Assistance Program in Oregon State Bar to provide forgivable loans to eligible public defense attorneys for outstanding student loans. Rules
SB 418	Directs public bodies to perform search, review and duplication work in responding to public records requests in least expensive manner reasonably possible. Labor and Business
SB 419	Requires subject employers to adopt policy allowing subject workers paid time off during shift to receive medical services related to worker's compensable injury or occupational disease. Human Services;Ways and Means
SB 422	Appropriates moneys to Department of Human Services for Hunger Task Force to support state's policy on hunger. Judiciary
	Allows motorcycle operator to travel between lanes of traffic under certain conditions.
SB 428	Labor and Business
	Modifies pay equity requirements for employers.
SB 429	Natural Resources
SB 430	Establishes certain requirements for member of board of directors of agricultural cooperative. Judiciary
SB 431	Establishes procedure for charging aggravated version of certain assault and attempted murder offenses when defendant causes permanent physical injury to victim during commission of crime. The Interstate 5 Bridge;Ways and Means
SB 432	Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for distribution to Port of Hood River for construction of Hood River-White Salmon Interstate Bridge. Health Care; Ways and Means
SB 440	Requires Oregon Health Authority to develop, implement and administer program to support consumer engagement efforts aimed at increasing and optimizing consumer involvement in planning and decision-making surrounding the access to, and the delivery of, behavioral health services in this state. Energy and Environment; Ways and Means
SB 441	Directs Department of Transportation to establish intensive planting pilot program to plant trees and vegetation in highway right of way for purpose of sequestering carbon. Health Care;Ways and Means
	Creates dental care provider incentive grant program within Oregon Health Authority to increase recruitment and retention of dental care providers.

SB 442	Labor and Business
SB 443	Permits contracting agency to grant preference to procuring for public use goods that are fabricated or processed, or services that are performed, entirely within this state if goods or services cost not more than five percent more than goods not processed or fabricated, or services not performed, entirely within this state if contracting agency can reasonably and credibly determine that procuring at higher price offsets environmental costs of transporting goods or service providers from outside this state. <b>Energy and Environment</b>
SB 444	Requires electric companies to reimburse qualified customers up to \$250 for purchase price of backup power source when power shutoff is likely to occur and power shutoff will likely last for eight or more hours. Energy and Environment; Ways and Means
SB 445	Directs Department of Environmental Quality to establish Recycling Innovators Grant Program. Transportation; Ways and Means
SB 446	Establishes Rural Traffic Safety Grant Fund to provide grants to rural cities for installation and improvement of traffic control devices and crosswalks. Finance and Revenue;Ways and Means
	Establishes refundable personal income tax credit of \$1,000 per qualifying child.
SB 447	Finance and Revenue
SB 448	Allows personal income taxpayer to subtract from taxable income amounts paid as interest on qualified education loans, if income does not exceed threshold amount. Labor and Business
SB 450	Repeals provisions requiring employers to pay overtime to agricultural workers who work in excess of maximum allowable hours. Health Care
SB 451	Exempts from labeling requirements drug intended to reverse opioid overdose when drug is dispensed by physician or physician assistant. Finance and Revenue
SB 452	Removes annual limit of \$1.53 million, adjusted for inflation, on allocations from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to County Fair Account. <b>Finance and Revenue</b>
	Prohibits physicians from performing irreversible gender reassignment surgery on minor.
SB 454	Finance and Revenue
	Allows exclusion from taxable estate for value of interest in family-owned business.
SB 456	Finance and Revenue
SB 457	Provides that Oregon estate tax is imposed only on estates of decedents dying on or before December 31, 2022. Labor and Business;Ways and Means
	Directs Employment Department to develop Agricultural Worker Overtime Relief Payment Program to provide eligible agricultural workers with payments for hours worked beyond 40



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	hours but not exceeding 48 hours per workweek.
<u>SB 460</u>	Rules;Ways and Means
SB 461	Directs Department of Revenue to make one-time transfer of funds to cities and counties in this state. Ways and Means
SB 462	Directs Oregon Business Development Department to develop and implement program to grant additional funding for certain capital construction projects affected by inflation or disruptions related to COVID-19 pandemic. Judiciary
SB 463	Authorizes law enforcement agency to release booking photo upon second or subsequent arrest of person depicted in photo within 12-month period, or when person depicted in photo is missing person. Health Care
SB 464	Prohibits health benefit plans from imposing prior authorization or other utilization review requirements on coverage of proton beam therapy that do not apply to coverage of radiation therapy. <b>Rules</b>
	Renames Public Service Building to Dennis Richardson Public Service Building.
SB 465	Finance and Revenue
SB 467	Provides that property of company that is organized and located outside of this state and exclusively operates jet boat excursion business on boundary rivers of this state and not on rivers within this state is not subject to central assessment for purposes of property taxation. <b>Judiciary</b>
SB 468	Establishes mandatory minimum sentence of 48 months' imprisonment for assault committed by correctional facility inmate against corrections officer. Labor and Business
SB 469	Changes minimum contract price at which prevailing rate of wage applies to public works projects from \$50,000 to amount that Oregon Department of Administrative Services determines by rule. Health Care;Ways and Means
SB 470	Establishes Indian Health Scholarship Program to provide free tuition and fees for qualifying Indian health profession students in exchange for student commitment to work at tribal service site after graduation. Judiciary
SB 472	Prohibits denial of medical assistance on basis that individual under 19 years of age is in detention pending adjudication. Judiciary
	Provides that county is exempt from applicability of statute banning use of dogs to hunt or pursue cougars if voters approve county measure proposed by initiative petition or referred to people by governing body of county.

SB 481	Provides that portion of Oregon Highway 82 shall be known as Deputy Raymond Williams and Deputy Michael Cheney Memorial Highway. Labor and Business
	Modifies requirements for employee to be eligible to take unpaid family and medical leave.
SB 483	Judiciary
SB 484	Allows operator offering or providing facilities for inherently dangerous sporting activity to require patron to provide anticipatory release from certain claims for liability, including claims arising out of negligence of operator and claims for unreasonable conditions created by operator. Health Care; Ways and Means
SB 485	Requires Oregon Health Authority to administer program to offer financial incentives to increase number of nurses in Oregon including by paying stipends to hospitals that provide clinical training opportunities to nurses. Health Care
SB 486	Extends health care provider incentive program to health care providers who are students enrolled in health professional training programs leading to licensure as licensed practical nurse or registered nurse. Health Care;Ways and Means
SB 487	Requires Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organization to pay reasonable per diem rate for patient whose discharge from hospital is delayed due to circumstances beyond hospital's control. Health Care; Ways and Means
SB 490	Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish grant program to provide financial support to certified dental sealant programs that promote and engage in oral health care coordination activities. Health Care; Ways and Means
	Directs Oregon Medical Board to support alliance program for family medicine residency training programs in this state.

<u>SB 511</u>	Directs Public Records Advocate to estimate biennial costs to carry out duties of advocate and to allocate and assess costs among public bodies of state government. Health Care
<u>SB 512</u>	Requires licensed health care provider to provide vaccine information packet to patient to whom licensed health care provider administers vaccine. Transportation
	Requires that fee for motor vehicle emission certificates of compliance issued after inspection that did not occur at department test station and did not use testing equipment owned by department not exceed lowest fee for other motor vehicle emissions certificates of compliance.
