<u>SB 1</u>	Finance and Revenue Directs Department of Revenue to develop schedule allowing personal income taxpayers to voluntarily report taxpayers' self-identified race and ethnicity identifiers.
<u>SB 46</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Requires Housing and Community Services Department to provide sample plans and grants for senior cottages.
<u>SB 51</u>	Education Directs public bodies and school districts to make facilities for youth sports available free of charge, except as necessary to cover maintenance expenses.
<u>SB 56</u>	Finance and Revenue Exempts from commercial activity subject to corporate activity tax reimbursements for certain health care services, including care provided to medical assistance recipients and to Medicare recipients.
<u>SB 61</u>	Finance and Revenue Exempts receipts from sales of prescription drugs by a pharmacy from commercial activity subject to corporate activity tax.
<u>SB 63</u>	Finance and Revenue Exempts from commercial activity subject to corporate activity tax reimbursements for certain health care services, including care provided to medical assistance recipients and to Medicare recipients.
<u>SB 66</u>	Finance and Revenue Increases maximum percentage of tax or fee that governing body of city or county may impose on sale of marijuana items.
<u>SB 68</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides for additional exemption against Oregon estate tax.
<u>SB 72</u>	Transportation;Ways and Means Establishes DMV Modernization Task Force to study options for expanding number of driver and motor vehicle services available to public through private providers.
<u>SB 78</u>	Rules Directs state agencies to offer reinstatement to employees who were terminated or who retired because of COVID-19 vaccine mandates.
<u>SB 88</u>	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Establishes state policy to increase net carbon sequestration and storage in natural and working lands.
<u>SB 128</u>	Labor and Business Provides that, for purposes of determining salary of certain member of Public Employees Retirement System, housing allowance paid to prison chaplain shall be treated as includable in member's taxable income under Oregon law.
<u>SB 136</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study personal income taxation.



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<u>SB 137</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study corporate excise and income tax system.
<u>SB 140</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study corporate activity tax.
<u>SB 141</u>	Finance and Revenue Updates connection date to federal Internal Revenue Code and other provisions of federal tax law.
<u>SB 150</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study property taxation.
<u>SB 151</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study Oregon's tax system.
<u>SB 152</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study state financial system.
<u>SB 153</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study interdependence of state and local tax systems in Oregon.
<u>SB 154</u>	Finance and Revenue Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study calculation of maximum assessed value when taxable property becomes newly eligible for, or is disqualified from, exemption or special assessment program.
<u>SB 160</u>	Rules Requires certain public bodies to reduce public records request fees by 40 percent if request is made in public interest.
<u>SB 162</u>	Rules Establishes Small Donor Elections Program to enable candidates for offices of state Representative and state Senator to receive 6-to-1 match on small dollar contributions.
<u>SB 163</u>	Rules Directs Secretary of State to study public records laws and operation of public records laws in Oregon, and to report to Legislative Assembly on findings.
<u>SB 164</u>	Rules Directs Secretary of State to study archives maintained in State of Oregon and to report to Legislative Assembly on findings of study.
<u>SB 165</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to study level of funding necessary to conduct elections in sustainable and consistent manner throughout state.
<u>SB 166</u>	Rules Explicitly guarantees electors right to vote and right to secret ballot.
<u>SB 203</u>	Rules Transfers Director of Affirmative Action from office of Governor to Oregon Department of



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	Administrative Services.
<u>SB 204</u>	Rules Declares state policy that state agencies and education service districts practice proactive transparency.
<u>SB 205</u>	Finance and Revenue Allows Department of Revenue to disclose to and give access to Employment Department employees, for purpose of detecting whether identity theft or fraud has been committed, otherwise confidential taxpayer information.
<u>SB 206</u>	Finance and Revenue Amends and repeals statutes to eliminate conflict between certain grants of property taxation authority and constitutional requirements related to property taxation.
<u>SB 207</u>	Rules Authorizes Oregon Government Ethics Commission to proceed on own motion to review and investigate, if commission has reason to believe that public body conducted meetings in executive session that were not in compliance with laws authorizing executive sessions.
<u>SB 219</u>	Judiciary Modifies timing of progress report superintendent of state mental hospital or director of facility to which defendant is committed must send court concerning defendant's fitness to proceed.
<u>SB 224</u>	Labor and Business Updates and modernizes statutes that regulate practice of architecture in this state to conform with actual current practice of architecture.
<u>SB 225</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that unused portion of amount of pass-through revenue bonds authorized for issuance in preceding biennium carries forward until legislation authorizing amount of pass-through revenue bonds for current biennium is enacted.
<u>SB 226</u>	Health Care Removes requirement that Oregon State Board of Nursing notify State Board of Pharmacy upon authorizing nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist to dispense prescription drugs.
<u>SB 227</u>	Health Care During emergency declared by Governor, allows Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue limited license to practice nursing to nurse licensed in another jurisdiction and to issue limited certificate as nursing assistant to nursing assistant authorized to practice in another jurisdiction.
<u>SB 228</u>	Labor and Business Specifies additional circumstances under which Construction Contractors Board may revoke, suspend, condition or refuse to issue or reissue license for construction contractor, or impose civil penalty for violation of laws that regulate work of construction contractors in this state.



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<u>SB 229</u>	Health Care Updates terminology concerning reporting of serious adverse events.
<u>SB 232</u>	Health Care Allows out-of-state physician or physician assistant to provide specified care to patients located in Oregon.
<u>SB 233</u>	Rules Increases salaries of state court judges.
<u>SB 234</u>	Judiciary Expands authority of Chief Justice of Supreme Court to make rules for gathering specified information and identifying and evaluating disparities and impacts in justice system in Oregon.
<u>SB 235</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Increases number of circuit court judges in certain judicial districts.
<u>SB 236</u>	Judiciary Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to adopt rules requiring law enforcement units to report certain incidents and complaints to commission.
<u>SB 504</u>	Energy and Environment Requires State Department of Energy to study incentives for net metering and community solar projects.
<u>SB 522</u>	Energy and Environment Changes name of "Oregon Global Warming Commission" to "Oregon Climate Action Commission." Modifies membership and duties of commission.
<u>SB 525</u>	Energy and Environment;Ways and Means Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt standards prohibiting engine exhaust and evaporative emissions from new small nonroad engines beginning January 1, 2026, unless a later date is required by federal Clean Air Act.
<u>SB 530</u>	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Establishes state policy regarding natural climate solutions.
<u>SB 540</u>	Finance and Revenue Exempts from state income for taxpayers 62 years of age or younger receiving retirement pay or pension for service in Armed Forces of the United States up to \$17,500 in retirement pay or pension received for service in Armed Forces of the United States and up to \$17,500 in retirement pay or pension received from other sources.
<u>SB 647</u>	Energy and Environment Prevents local governments from prohibiting natural gas use in or availability for new or existing residential or commercial buildings.
<u>SB 653</u>	Natural Resources;Ways and Means Appropriates \$50 million to State Forestry Department to fund increased forest thinning operations in specified wildfire-prone counties.



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<u>SB 654</u>	Natural Resources Removes requirement that State Forestry Department oversee development of statewide map of wildfire risk.
<u>SB 665</u>	Natural Resources Requires State Forester to actively manage state forestlands to achieve and maintain low forest fuel load levels.
<u>SB 714</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that, for estate of decedents dying on or after January 1, 2023, Oregon estate tax is not due unless value of Oregon taxable estate equals or exceeds \$12.92 million.
<u>SB 722</u>	Finance and Revenue Permits contracting agency, owner, contractor or subcontractor to mutually agree to deposit retainage withheld into account other than interest-bearing account in bank, savings bank, trust company or savings association.
<u>SB 726</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that Oregon estate tax is imposed only on estates of decedents dying on or before January 1, 2023.
