<u>SJR 19</u>	Transportation Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit public body from assessing highway toll unless toll was assessed before January 1, 2018, toll is assessed for use of Bridge of the Gods, Hood River Bridge or Hood River-White Salmon Interstate Bridge, or proposed toll is approved by majority of total votes cast in elections held in counties with border located within 15-mile radius of any section of highway proposed to be tolled.
<u>SB 26</u>	Labor and Business;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset for property tax exemption or deferral for certain industrial improvements newly constructed or installed in rural areas.
<u>SB 45</u>	Finance and Revenue;Ways and Means Establishes Task Force on Tax Competitiveness.
<u>SB 50</u>	Education;Tax Expenditures Creates tax credit for contributions to youth activity organizations.
<u>SB 55</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Restores corporate excise tax credit allowed for qualified research activities and sets increased maximum credit amount.
<u>SB 67</u>	Housing and Development;Tax Expenditures Creates income tax credit for lost rental income of landlord, forgone due to prohibition on evictions and rent nonpayment actions during COVID-19 emergency period.
<u>SB 129</u>	Education;Ways and Means Extends sunset for credit for certified Opportunity Grant contributions.
<u>SB 131</u>	Housing and Development;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset for tax credit for affordable housing lenders.

<u>SB 146</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset of exemption for property of centrally assessed companies.
<u>SB 147</u>	Housing and Development;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset for exemption of single-unit housing.
<u>SB 148</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset of tax exemption for property of surviving spouses of certain public safety officers.

<u>SB 157</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Extends sunset for shared services distributions.
<u>SB 158</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Extends sunsets for pass-through business alternative income tax and related personal income tax credit.
<u>SB 159</u>	Labor and Business Permits contracting agency to grant preference to procuring for public use goods or services that are provided by nonprofit organization incorporated, organized, formed or created for charitable purpose under laws of this state, if goods or services cost not more than 10 percent more than goods or services available from contractor that is not nonprofit organization.
<u>SB 433</u>	Health Care Adds two members who are physician assistants or retired physician assistants to membership of Oregon Medical Board.
<u>SB 434</u>	Housing and Development;Ways and Means Creates Eviction Mediation Program within Housing and Community Services Department.
<u>SB 435</u>	Housing and Development;Tax Expenditures Establishes subtraction from personal taxable income for eligible rental payments made by eligible renters.
<u>SB 436</u>	Finance and Revenue Establishes tax rate for taxable income from partnerships, S corporations and sole proprietorships.
<u>SB 437</u>	Housing and Development Allows production of food in planned community by lot owners and their tenants.
<u>SB 438</u>	Human Services Requires Department of Human Services to seek waiver of federal requirements in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program in order to allow recipients of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance to receive advance installment payments of tax credit for dependent care expenses.
<u>SB 590</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Department of Justice for establishment of program addressing crimes committed against persons with disabilities.
<u>SB 591</u>	Labor and Business Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issue of labor trafficking in this state.
<u>SB 592</u>	Labor and Business Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to conduct comprehensive inspections of fixed place of employment when occupational death or three or more willful or repeated violations have occurred.
<u>SB 593</u>	Labor and Business Requires Employment Department to study issues related to family and medical leave insurance program.

<u>SB 594</u>	Labor and Business Requires payment of prevailing rate of wage for demolition of or removal of hazardous waste from road, highway, building, structure or improvement in public improvement contract that uses \$750,000 or more of public funds or that occurs on real property that state agency owns, including demolition or removal of hazardous waste that occurs in connection with construction, reconstruction, renovation or painting of road, highway, building, structure or improvement.
<u>SB 597</u>	Judiciary Directs certifying agencies to report annually to Oregon Criminal Justice Commission on victim helpfulness certification requests.
<u>SB 601</u>	Housing and Development Requires owners of multifamily rental housing to offer right of first refusal to tenants who form tenant committee and membership entity.
<u>SB 603</u>	Housing and Development;Ways and Means Establishes People's Housing Assistance Fund Demonstration Program, administered by Department of Human Services, to provide 12 monthly payments of \$1,000 to individuals who are experiencing homelessness, are at risk of homelessness, are severely rent burdened or earn at or below 60 percent of area median income.
<u>SB 611</u>	Housing and Development Increases amount residential landlord owes tenant for landlord-cause termination of tenancy.
<u>SB 616</u>	Labor and Business Allows holder of direct shipper permit to ship up to five cases of cider or malt beverages, each containing not more than nine liters, per month to Oregon resident.
<u>SB 621</u>	Human Services;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Oregon Health Authority to allocate to community mental health programs for oversight of residential facilities and for conducting abuse investigations.
<u>SB 623</u>	Judiciary Requires Judicial Department, Department of Corrections, Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator and Oregon Health Authority to survey capacity of systems to provide required services to individuals and meet requirements related to hearing to determine fitness to proceed.
<u>SB 624</u>	Health Care;Ways and Means Establishes certified community behavioral health clinic program in Oregon Health Authority.
<u>SB 625</u>	Information Management and Technology;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish pilot program for evaluating use of challenge-based procurement to conduct certain information technology procurements.
<u>SB 626</u>	Finance and Revenue Modifies definition of "descendant" for purposes of decedents' estates to include person with functional child relationship with decedent and functional child's descendants.

<u>SB 627</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for purposes of deposit in Universal Representation Fund.
<u>SB 628</u>	Health Care Requires health benefit plan and health care service contract coverage of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.
<u>SB 630</u>	Energy and Environment;Ways and Means Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds and transfer of net proceeds to Oregon Business Development Department.
<u>SB 631</u>	Labor and Business Permits employees of certain state agencies to refuse to work additional mandatory overtime shift scheduled by employer when employee has already worked mandatory overtime in same month.
<u>SB 632</u>	Housing and Development;Ways and Means Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to provide grant and loan to specified entity to develop multifamily dwellings, affordable to moderate income families, using scaled modular or prefabricated construction.
<u>SB 635</u>	Transportation Authorizes county governing body to require and charge fee for permit to construct or alter line, fixture or facility within right of way of public road under jurisdiction of county.
<u>SB 636</u>	Health Care Prohibits public bodies and business affiliates of public bodies from requiring person to wear face covering or discriminating against person on basis of failure or refusal to wear face covering.
<u>SB 637</u>	Rules Prohibits individual from collecting and returning ballot of another individual, subject to specified exceptions.
<u>SB 638</u>	Health Care Makes discrimination against individual based on vaccination history, individual's refusal to obtain vaccination or individual's failure to provide proof of immunity to communicable disease unlawful employment practice.
<u>SB 640</u>	Rules Establishes durational limits for states of emergency declared under certain statutes.
<u>SB 642</u>	Health Care Prohibits public bodies and private entities from requiring person to receive COVID-19 vaccination or to possess COVID-19 immunity passport, immunity pass or other evidence certifying COVID-19 vaccination or immunity status.
<u>SB 645</u>	Transportation Provides one month extension on use of studded tires for vehicles traveling in Deschutes County.

<u>SB 649</u>	Judiciary Creates crime of controlled substances homicide.
<u>SB 650</u>	Judiciary Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to classify crime of felon in possession of a firearm as crime category 8.
<u>SB 655</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, frozen assessed value for homestead of individual at least 68 years of age, or person with disability, if homestead and individual would be eligible for homestead property tax deferral program but for fact that homestead is pledged as security for reverse mortgage.
<u>SB 656</u>	Natural Resources Allows certain local governments to amend urban growth boundaries to include lands to be used for needed housing.
<u>SB 657</u>	Health Care Establishes that employee may bring claim against employer if employee suffers vaccine injury, vaccine was required by employer as condition of employment and employer refused to exempt employee from receiving vaccine as required by law.
<u>SB 659</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Provides that U.S. Highway 30 in Oregon shall be known as Gold Star Families Memorial Highway.
<u>SB 660</u>	Rules Specifies that new or increased fees adopted by state agency do not become effective unless approved by Legislative Assembly by law.
<u>SB 661</u>	Rules Prohibits lobbyist from serving as chairperson of interim committee, legislative work group or legislative task force.
<u>SB 662</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides that, for estate of decedents dying on or after January 1, 2023, Oregon estate tax is not due unless value of Oregon taxable estate equals or exceeds \$12.92 million.
<u>SB 663</u>	Labor and Business Changes calculation of final average salary for purposes of Public Employees Retirement System to use five years of salary instead of three years, for salary paid on and after January 1, 2024.
<u>SB 664</u>	Judiciary Creates crime of threatening to commit a terroristic act.
<u>SB 666</u>	Health Care Requires person to review medical history and obtain written consent of parent or guardian before administering vaccine or immune product to child under 18 years of age.
<u>SB 667</u>	Rules Requires that all executive clemency actions by Governor be initiated by application and follow specified procedures.

<u>SB 668</u>	Health Care Prohibits assessment of civil penalty or fine for violation of state occupational safety or health measure if no disease outbreak of COVID-19 occurred as result of violation.
<u>SB 669</u>	Finance and Revenue;Tax Expenditures Restores corporate excise tax credit allowed for qualified research activities.
<u>SB 670</u>	Judiciary Provides that person whose driving privileges are permanently revoked may request hearing to restore privileges after three years instead of 10 years, if revocation was imposed following conviction of felony driving while under influence or third or subsequent offense of driving while under influence.
<u>SB 671</u>	Transportation Directs Department of Transportation to provide walk-in appointments for written driver license test.
<u>SB 673</u>	Natural Resources Requires Deschutes County to approve certain applications to develop manufactured dwelling or recreational vehicle parks outside urban growth boundary.
<u>SB 675</u>	Labor and Business Permits Electrical and Elevator Board to determine fitness of person who holds journeyman electrician license or equivalent license issued by governmental authority that regulates electrical trades in another state.
<u>SB 680</u>	Information Management and Technology;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Beacon Broadband for development of broadband service infrastructure in southern Oregon coast region.
<u>SB 683</u>	Natural Resources Authorizes counties to identify lands that must be made available for industrial use.
<u>SB 684</u>	Housing and Development Limits applicant screening charge to \$10.
<u>SB 686</u>	Judiciary Authorizes governing bodies of certain public entities that own or control public building to adopt policy, ordinance or regulation or precluding affirmative defense for possession of firearms in public building and adjacent grounds by concealed handgun licensees.
<u>SB 687</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Eliminates six-month residency requirement for issuance of angling or shellfish license to qualifying disabled veteran.
<u>SB 688</u>	Judiciary Allows witness to waive personal service of subpoena by electronic mail.
<u>SB 693</u>	Transportation Establishes voluntary bicycle registration program.

<u>SB 696</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Department of Justice out of General Fund to fund animal cruelty-focused attorney within department's Criminal Justice Division.
<u>SB 702</u>	Housing and Development Allows Appraiser Certification and Licensure Board to require training on implicit bias and state and federal fair housing laws for real estate appraisers.
<u>SB 708</u>	Labor and Business Requires labor organization that is exclusive representative of public employees to prepare annual financial disclosure report describing labor organization's expenditures of moneys collected by and paid to labor organization.
<u>SB 709</u>	Rules Modifies public meeting notice requirements for meetings held in executive session.
<u>SB 719</u>	Transportation Defines terms used in Article IX, section 16, of Oregon Constitution.
<u>SB 720</u>	Housing and Development Allows Housing and Community Services Department to modify grant to allow use of remaining moneys to compensate certain landlords not otherwise reimbursed for unpaid rent during COVID-19 emergency period.
<u>SB 728</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs;Tax Expenditures Establishes income tax credit for volunteer firefighters.
