Measure	Committee/Catchline
<u>HCR 204</u>	Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs Recognizes and honors Deputy Allen Burdic for his service to this state.
<u>HB 4013</u>	Energy and Environment Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from enforcing the provisions of the producer responsibility program applicable to wine packaging. Sunsets on July 1, 2026.
<u>HB 4016</u>	Natural Resources and Wildfire Makes certain changes to the Prescribed Fire Liability Pilot Program.
<u>HB 4020</u>	Rules Requires an applicant for a commission as a notary public to complete a course of study offered by the Secretary of State before taking the required examination, even if the applicant already holds a commission in Oregon.
<u>HB 4063</u>	Housing and Development Requires Metro counties to plan for the housing needs of Metro urban unincorporated lands.
<u>HB 4090</u>	Energy and Environment Prohibits the Energy Facility Siting Council from exercising jurisdiction over or requiring a site certificate for an energy facility that is a renewable energy facility or transmission line, is sited wholly within federal lands and is subject to review under the National Environmental Policy Act.
<u>HB 4113</u>	Health Care Requires an insurer, a pharmacy benefit manager, the Public Employees' Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and a health care service contractor to count payments made by or on behalf of an enrollee for the costs of certain prescription drugs when calculating the enrollee's contribution to an out-of-pocket maximum, deductible, copayment, coinsurance or other required cost-sharing for the drugs.
<u>HB 4138</u>	Labor and Business Allows the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to issue provisional temporary service permits to an applicant for a service permit.
<u>HB 4145</u>	Judiciary Creates the crime of using an animal in a display of animal crushing. Criminalizes the creation of a visual recording of aggravated animal abuse.
<u>HB 4146</u>	Judiciary Provides that a petition for a Family Abuse Prevention Act order, Elderly Persons and Persons with Disabilities Abuse Prevention Act order or sexual abuse restraining order may be filed in the county in which the abuse occurred.
<u>HB 4160</u>	Education Modifies the length of time by which a person is considered a student for purposes of determining if conduct is prohibited sexual conduct.
<u>HB 4164</u>	Education Removes the condition on reimbursement for expenses for nonlegislative members of the Sexual Misconduct Survey Council.
