<u>SCR 201</u>	Rules Commends 2019 national champion Southern Oregon University Raiders softball team for outstanding season.
<u>SCR 202</u>	Rules Commemorates 100th anniversary of federal Rehabilitation Act and celebrates success of vocational rehabilitation in supporting Oregonians with disabilities to join workforce.
<u>SCR 203</u>	Rules Recognizes 2019 Oregon Women of Achievement for outstanding leadership and service to people of Oregon.
<u>SCR 204</u>	Rules Congratulates Rogue Creamery for winning top prize at World Cheese Awards.
<u>SCR 205</u>	Rules Commemorates 50th anniversary of Portland Trail Blazers.
<u>SCR 206</u>	Rules Recognizes and honors _____ for his service to his country.
<u>SJM 201</u>	Rules Applies to Congress to call convention for purpose of proposing amendments to United States Constitution that address campaign finance reform.
<u>SJM 202</u>	Rules Urges Congress to enact legislation that addresses medical care and disability compensation for veterans exposed to burn pits while serving overseas.
<u>SJR 201</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to modify portion of each house of Legislative Assembly needed to be in attendance for quorum necessary for house to conduct business.
<u>SJR 202</u>	Rules Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to eliminate even-numbered year regular sessions of Legislative Assembly.
<u>SB 1501</u>	Education Permits students participating in intercollegiate sports to earn compensation for certain services and for name, image or likeness and to retain professional representation or athlete agent.
<u>SB 1502</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Establishes Agricultural Cooperative Member Low-Interest Loan Fund.
<u>SB 1503</u>	Judiciary Provides that person commits offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants if person has blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or more by weight within two hours after driving vehicle.
<u>SB 1504</u>	Finance and Revenue Directs Department of Environmental Quality to study potential uses of government



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	revenue from program for placing price on greenhouse gas emissions.
<u>SB 1505</u>	Labor and Business;Ways and Means Allows certain former employees of office of President of Senate who were separated or terminated from employment due to certain unlawful conduct to file complaint with Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries within one year after passage of Act.
<u>SB 1506</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness Establishes Public Records Advocate as independent office within executive department.
<u>SB 1507</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness Directs Legislative Policy and Research Office to create list of executive branch regulatory boards and commissions no later than December 1, 2021.
<u>SB 1508</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness Directs Office of Emergency Management to create and maintain database of community emergency response teams accessible by emergency management agencies and emergency program managers.
<u>SB 1509</u>	Rules Explicitly authorizes county clerk and personnel employed by county clerk to remove contents from return identification and secrecy envelopes of ballots delivered to county clerk.
<u>SB 1510</u>	Rules Requires Secretary of State to conduct study and analyze implementation of laws relating to elections that were passed during 2019 regular session of Legislative Assembly.
<u>SB 1511</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to adopt by rule and administer program for authorizing voluntary projects for stream restoration and habitat improvement through construction of environmental restoration weirs.
<u>SB 1512</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Expresses state policy to identify lands acquired by State Board of Forestry that have limited revenue-generation potential or that provide high-value recreational or conservation benefits.
<u>SB 1513</u>	Environment and Natural Resources Requires Department of Environmental Quality or State Department of Agriculture approval as prerequisite to construction, installation, operation or maintenance of large confined animal feeding operation or large concentrated animal feeding operation.
<u>SB 1514</u>	Wildfire Reduction and Recovery;Ways and Means Requires State Forestry Department to establish demonstration projects for reducing wildfire risk on forestlands and rangelands.
<u>SB 1515</u>	Wildfire Reduction and Recovery Directs office of State Treasurer to research creation of wildfire workforce foundation and report to committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to wildfire no later than September 15, 2020.



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<u>SB 1516</u>	Wildfire Reduction and Recovery;Ways and Means Creates program for periodic review and modernization of State Forestry Department structure and programs to ensure effectiveness and efficiency, including but not limited to department programs relating to wildfire.
<u>SB 1517</u>	Human Services Makes nonsubstantive, technical, grammatical and syntactic corrections to statutes related to human services.
<u>SB 1518</u>	Human Services Directs Department of Human Services to submit documents necessary to finalize certain pending adoptions on or before June 30, 2020.
<u>SB 1519</u>	Human Services Modifies provisions relating to criminal records checks performed by Department of Human Services and Oregon Health Authority.
<u>SB 1520</u>	Education Expands definition of term "eligible student." Modifies school reimbursement rates for purposes of schools that provide free or reduced price meals under National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program.
<u>SB 1521</u>	Education Integrates foundational curricula and unified statewide transfer agreements into Transfer Student Bill of Rights and Responsibilities.
<u>SB 1522</u>	Education Modifies definitions of "sexual conduct" and "student" for purposes of requirements for education providers related to abuse of and sexual conduct toward students.
<u>SB 1523</u>	Health Care;Judiciary Requires health care practitioner to exercise proper degree of care to preserve health and life of child born alive after abortion or attempted abortion.
<u>SB 1524</u>	Rules Prohibits candidates for state office from accepting contributions in excess of amounts specified and from sources not specified.
<u>SB 1525</u>	Labor and Business Establishes requirements for business firm advertising construction project that will be subject to property tax exemption program.
<u>SB 1526</u>	Health Care Describes evidence that Health Licensing Office may consider to determine if applicant for residential care facility administrator license has earned high school diploma or equivalent.
<u>SB 1527</u>	Labor and Business Modifies requirements for enforceable noncompetition agreement.
<u>SB 1528</u>	Finance and Revenue Updates connection date to federal Internal Revenue Code and other provisions of federal tax law.



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<u>SB 1529</u>	Finance and Revenue Repeals special apportionment statutes applicable to income of interstate broadcasters, for purposes of corporate excise taxation.
<u>SB 1530</u>	Environment and Natural Resources;Ways and Means Modifies statewide greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals.
<u>SB 1531</u>	Finance and Revenue Makes corrections to and updates tax statutes.
<u>SB 1532</u>	Housing and Development;Ways and Means Establishes Homeownership Repair and Rehabilitation Pilot Program within Housing and Community Services Department to provide grants to entities for providing financial assistance to persons in low income households for repair and rehabilitation of residences.
<u>SB 1533</u>	Housing and Development Authorizes Housing and Community Services Department to provide grants and technical assistance to organizations assisting tenants in eviction proceedings.
<u>SB 1534</u>	Housing and Development Makes operative date earlier for provisions requiring Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to prepare formal charges and pursue matters in court on behalf of complainants who allege discrimination in real property transactions.
<u>SB 1535</u>	Health Care Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to investigate methods for collecting information about rebates and markups used in pharmaceutical supply chain and to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly recommendations for collecting information.
<u>SB 1536</u>	Wildfire Reduction and Recovery;Ways and Means Requires electric company to operate in compliance with risk-based wildfire protection plan acknowledged by Public Utility Commission.
<u>SB 1537</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Directs Office of Emergency Management to develop and administer program to ensure that certain number of Oregon households are prepared to be self-sufficient for at least two weeks after emergency.
<u>SB 1538</u>	Judiciary Authorizes city, county, metropolitan service district, school district, college or university to adopt ordinance or policy limiting or precluding affirmative defense for possession of firearms in public buildings by concealed handgun licensees.
<u>SB 1539</u>	Education Designates Oregon Institute of Technology as Oregon's Polytechnic University.
<u>SB 1540</u>	Judiciary Requires certain persons that service student loans in this state to obtain or renew license.
<u>SB 1541</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, frozen assessed value for homestead of individual at least 68 years old, or person with disability, if homestead and



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	individual would be eligible for homestead property tax deferral program but for fact that homestead is pledged as security for reverse mortgage.
<u>SB 1542</u>	Veterans Dedicates portion of State Capitol State Park to Vietnam War memorial to be funded and constructed by qualified nonprofit corporation recognized and acknowledged by Director of Veterans' Affairs.
<u>SB 1543</u>	Veterans Authorizes issuance of group sportspac license to qualifying facility or program.
<u>SB 1544</u>	Education Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to adopt by rule additional minimum standards regarding source of tuition revenue for licensing of career schools and schools authorized to confer degrees.
<u>SB 1545</u>	Judiciary;Ways and Means Directs Department of State Police to maintain staffing level of at least 15 patrol troopers per 100,000 residents of this state, beginning January 1, 2030.
<u>SB 1546</u>	Judiciary Specifies procedures for providing notice to defendant in charging instrument and at arraignment when conviction would result in firearm prohibition.
<u>SB 1547</u>	Judiciary Creates exception to requirement that court proceeding involving person in custody be transferred from court facility in Gresham to Portland if defendant is not in custody and certain warrants have been vacated or executed.
<u>SB 1548</u>	Health Care Establishes Essential Health Benefits Advisory Committee to advise Department of Consumer and Business Services on anticipated financial impact to state of pending legislation requiring coverage of additional health benefit in health benefit plans offered in this state.
<u>SB 1549</u>	Health Care Directs Oregon Board of Dentistry to issue dental therapist license to qualified applicant.
<u>SB 1550</u>	Health Care Allows expanded practice dental hygienist to perform interim therapeutic restoration.
<u>SB 1551</u>	Health Care Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide biannual reports to committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health on issues related to financial requirements and financial reporting requirements imposed on coordinated care organizations.
<u>SB 1552</u>	Mental Health Directs Oregon Health Authority to evaluate specified issues related to certified community behavioral health clinics and report findings and analysis to interim committees of Legislative Assembly by December 1, 2020.



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<u>SB 1553</u>	Mental Health Requires Oregon Health Authority, under direction of Oregon Health Policy Board and in collaboration with specified stakeholder groups, to identify, assess and prepare report on regulatory and policy barriers to effective and timely behavioral health treatment for individuals with co-occurring disorders.
<u>SB 1554</u>	Environment and Natural Resources;Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Ocean Science Fund, State Department of Fish and Wildlife, Higher Education Coordinating Commission and Oregon Department of Administrative Services for certain ocean program purposes.
<u>SB 1555</u>	Housing and Development Authorizes development of certain parsonages on lots or parcels with places of worship either existing or being developed in conformance with land use regulations.
<u>SB 1556</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Authorizes Oregon Liquor Control Commission to create data and analysis regarding commercial sales and commercial industries.
<u>SB 1557</u>	Judiciary Provides that definition of "abuse" does not include refusal to vaccinate child or decision to delay vaccination of child.
<u>SB 1558</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Extends sunset on CourtCare pilot programs in Marion and Polk Counties to January 2, 2022.
<u>SB 1560</u>	Finance and Revenue Provides for additional exemption against Oregon estate tax.
<u>SB 1561</u>	Judiciary Directs State Department of Agriculture to develop Oregon Hemp Plan for establishment of Oregon Hemp Program for commercial production and sale of hemp.
<u>SB 1562</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Creates program for gathering and reviewing data and research regarding ground water in Umatilla Basin and creating implementation plan to improve ground water quality and obtain full or partial removal of ground water management area designation from Lower Umatilla Basin Groundwater Management Area.
<u>SB 1563</u>	Labor and Business Amends requirements for limited renewable energy technician license.
<u>SB 1564</u>	Labor and Business Establishes product stewardship program for mattresses.
<u>SB 1565</u>	Finance and Revenue;Ways and Means Establishes rates of compensation to be paid by Oregon Liquor Control Commission to distillery retail outlet agent for distilled liquor retail sales by agent.
<u>SB 1566</u>	Human Services;Ways and Means Modifies Oregon Promise program to extend eligibility to certain Oregon foster children who attain their highest level of education while in out-of-state placements.



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<u>SB 1567</u>	Judiciary Restricts arbitration award from ordering disciplinary action that differs from disciplinary action imposed by law enforcement agency if arbitrator makes finding that misconduct occurred consistent with agency's finding of misconduct, and disciplinary action imposed by agency is consistent with provisions of discipline guide or discipline matrix adopted by agency as result of collective bargaining and incorporated into agency's disciplinary policies.
<u>SB 1568</u>	Judiciary Modifies protective proceedings to permit vulnerable youth guardianships for adults between 18 and 21 years of age who are not citizens or lawful permanent residents of United States and who are unable to be reunified with parent due to abuse, neglect or abandonment that occurred before adult attained 18 years of age.
<u>SB 1569</u>	General Government and Emergency Preparedness;Ways and Means Establishes State Board of Towing within Department of Transportation.
<u>SB 1571</u>	Labor and Business;Ways and Means Provides state-funded unemployment insurance benefits to individuals who are unemployed due to bankruptcy filed in calendar year 2019 by agricultural cooperative doing business in Oregon.
<u>SB 1572</u>	Education Establishes subject-matter credit requirements that students must satisfy in order to receive high school diploma.
<u>SB 1573</u>	Judiciary Modifies procedure for expunction of certain juvenile records.
<u>SB 1574</u>	Environment and Natural Resources;Ways and Means Modifies statewide greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals.
<u>SB 1575</u>	Judiciary Defines terms related to fitness to proceed.
<u>SB 1576</u>	Judiciary Provides that judicial marshal certified by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System.
<u>SB 1577</u>	Health Care Prohibits distributing, selling or allowing to be sold flavored inhalant delivery system products.
