Special Election, January 26, 2010

The following statewide measures, passed by the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly at its 2009 regular session and signed by the Governor, were referred to the ballot by referendum petition and voted on by the people at the special election held on January 26, 2010:

Ballot Title	Proposed By	Outcome
No. 66 – Raises Tax on Household Income At and Above \$250,000 (and \$125,000 for Individual Filers). Reduces Income Taxes on Unemployment Benefits in 2009. Provides Funds Currently Budgeted for Education, Health Care, Public Safety, Other Services.	HB 2649 (chapter 746, Oregon Laws 2009)	Passed
No. 67 – Raises \$10 Corporate Minimum Tax, Business Minimum Tax, Corporate Profits Tax. Provides Funds Currently Budgeted for Education, Health Care, Public Safety, Other Services.	HB 3405 (chapter 745, Oregon Laws 2009)	Passed

Ballot Title	Proposed By	Outcome
No. 68 – Revises Constitution: Allows state to issue bonds to match voter approved school district bonds for school capital costs.	HJR 13 (2009)	Passed
No. 69 – Amends Constitution: Continues and modernizes authority for lowest cost borrowing for community colleges and public universities.	HJR 101 (2010)	Passed

General Election, November 2, 2010

The following statewide measures, proposed by the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly at its 2009 regular session and at its 2010 special session, or proposed by initiative petition, were voted on by the people at the general election held November 2, 2010:

No. 70 – Amends Constitution: Expands Availability of Home Ownership Loans for Oregon Veterans through Oregon War Veterans’ Fund.	HJR 7 (2009)	Passed
No. 71 – Amends Constitution: Requires Legislature to Meet Annually; Limits Length of Legislative Sessions; Provides Exceptions.	SJR 41 (2010)	Passed
No. 72 – Amends Constitution: Authorizes Exception to \$50,000 state borrowing limit for state’s real and personal property projects.	SJR 48 (2010)	Passed
No. 73 – Requires Increased Minimum Sentences for Certain Repeated Sex Crimes, Incarceration for Repeated Driving Under Influence	Initiative 13	Passed
No. 74 – Establishes Medical Marijuana Supply System and Assistance and Research Programs; Allows Limited Selling of Marijuana.	Initiative 28	Failed
No. 75 – Authorizes Multnomah County casino; casino to contribute monthly revenue percentage to state for specified purposes.	Initiative 77	Failed
No. 76 – Amends Constitution: Continues lottery funding for parks, beaches, wildlife habitat, watershed protection beyond 2014; modifies funding process.	Initiative 70	Passed
