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Government-to-Government Relationships Oregon Emergency Management Annual Report January—December 2011

This report identifies the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) activities during the year 2011 regarding compliance with ORS 401 and Government-to-Government relationships with the Native American Tribes in Oregon.

OEM has continued coordination in 2011 with federally-recognized tribes of Oregon in accordance with the National Response Framework and the State Emergency Operations Plan.

2011 Accomplishments:

Program Area: Administration of Grants:

OEM worked with tribal partners to administer grants for emergency program management and emergency services for tribal governments.

Homeland Security Grant Administration

2011 Homeland Security Grant Administration

- Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Indians- \$34,000 for the Statewide Emergency Operations Plan project.
- Confederated Tribes of the Siletz:- \$37,695 for interoperable communications projects, water storage projects and Citizen Emergency Response Teams.

Program Area: Planning, Training, and Technical Assistance

OEM has worked with tribal governments to enhance emergency preparedness, response and recovery.

State-Wide Emergency Operations Plan Revision

In FY 2011 the following tribes have entered into the Statewide Emergency Operations Plan project:

- Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Indians
- Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs

The Statewide Emergency Operations Plan project continues coordination with the following::

- Confederated Tribes of the Siletz Indians
- Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians
- Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation

OEM participated in the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians Natural Hazard Mitigation Planning process.

Tribal Assistance-National Incident Management System Compliance

Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5) Management of Domestic Incidents called for the establishment of a single, comprehensive National Incident Management System (NIMS).

Department of Homeland Security has directed that NIMS compliancy will be an ongoing effort which enhances our ability to work together during disasters.

Oregon Tribes continue to report NIMS compliance assistance, NIMSCAST and all other NIMS issues are referred to FEMA Region X.

Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians and Coos County Mutual Aid/Disaster Assistance

OEM, along with FEMA Region X has continued assisting Coos County and the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians in development of assistance agreements as well as understanding how each government can enable the other to be disaster resistant.

Statewide Exercise Drills:

Klamath Tribes have been given access and training on OpsCenter emergency operations ordering and tracking software. The Klamath Tribes participated in the December 7th Ops Center drill with Klamath County Emergency Management.

Public Preparedness Outreach:

In 2011, OEM participated in the Coquille Indian Tribal Restoration day activities by presenting personal preparedness information and outreach to tribal members.

Program Area: Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) Coordination with Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR)

CSEPP provides liaison with the CTUIR Board of Trustees, as well as coordination and training assistance for the CTUIR with respect to all CSEPP matters. This function is primarily accomplished through the Eastern Regional office of OEM located near CTUIR in Pendleton, Oregon.

Training Provided to CTUIR:

In February 2011, under oversight of the Pendleton Eastern Region OEM office, Oregon Health Authority staff working out of Hermiston, OR, provided on site equipment for refresher training to CTUIR Fire/Medical personnel. The Tribal Fire Department and Police Department also participated in the Annual CSEPP Exercise on April 12, 2011, which involved a simulated chemical accident scenario at the Umatilla Army Chemical Depot. They were directly responsible for setting up a decontamination trailer and operating such a station for St. Anthony's hospital in Pendleton.

CTUIR also participated in an OEM sponsored local community awareness earthquake table-top (facilitated discussion) exercise conducted at Tamastsiht Cultural Center on April 14, 2011. Yellow Hawk medical clinic and Tribal emergency management personnel were in attendance.

CUTIR participation in Local Public Safety Coordinating Councils:

CTUIR regularly participates in the quarterly CSEPP Governing Board meetings. The Public Safety Director, the Emergency Manager Coordinator and Tribal Fire Chief also participate in Community Response Coordination Committee (CRCC) meetings with other local first responders and emergency managers. In addition, Tribal management and staff regularly participate in manager level Integrated Process Team (IPT) meetings with Oregon and Washington State emergency management professionals. They also participate in the Annual Exercise Planning meetings which were held on a monthly basis. Currently, CTUIR's Emergency Operations Center building supports every simulated exercise as well as real world incidents involving public safety events. This same facility has also hosted a variety of public safety meetings for the entire local community over the course of this annual reporting period.

CSEPP Closeout: It should be noted that with the elimination of the chemical weapon stockpile at the Umatilla Army Depot on November 15, 2011, the mission of CSEPP as a public safety enhancement program is coming to a close. The 180 congressionally mandated period to decommission CSEPP systems has already started with full CSEPP program closure scheduled to be on May 14, 2012. All stakeholders (to include CTUIR) will then close the CSEPP public safety emergency management chapter. Thus, this will be the last CSEPP report.

Program Area: Warm Springs Tribal 911 Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP)

OEM is mandated to provide for the administration of the legislative mandate for statewide Enhanced 9-1-1 telephone services to allow uniform, prompt, and efficient access to public and private safety services for the citizens of, and visitors to, the State of Oregon.

OEM provides assistance and services the operations of the Tribal PSAP located in the Warm Springs Reservation. In 2011 OEM assisted Warm Springs with the acquisition and installation of 911 consoles for the Warm Springs PSAP.
