The bill requires DAS to provide a report to an appropriate committee of the Legislative Assembly that considers questions related to public contracting. The report shall contain information about Special Procurements conducted under ORS 279B.085, which requires approval from DAS unless the state agency is the Secretary of State or the Treasurer.

Eighteen (18) state agencies conducted special procurements and provided to DAS the required information, which DAS compiled in the attached SB 1518(4) Report. Ten (10) state agencies reported that they did not conduct a Special Procurement in 2012.
