RE: 2019 Administrative Rules Annual Report

ORS 183.403 requires state agencies to report annually on their administrative rulemaking actions, both permanent and temporary.

In 2019, Oregon Labor & Industries filed 17 Permanent Administrative Orders that adopted, amended, and repealed administrative rules. Table 1 identifies the total number of permanent rules adopted, amended, or repealed.

In 2019, Oregon Labor & Industries filed 1 Temporary Administrative Order that amended the following administrative rule:

- **839-011-0088 - Apprenticeship and Training Committees — Registration of Apprenticeship Agreements**
