Dear President Courtney and Speaker Kotek:

ORS 144.660 directs me to report to the Legislative Assembly at its regular session each reprieve, commutation, pardon, remission of penalty or forfeiture granted since the beginning of the previous legislative session. My report is as follows.

Since March 3, 2016, I have granted four pardons. I have granted no reprieves, commutations, or remissions of penalty or forfeiture. Between March 3, 2016 and today, 17 applications for commutation of sentence, seven pardons, one reprieve and two remission of fines have been denied. There are 151 commutation applications pending. There are 81 pardons applications pending. Five reprieve applications are pending. There are four remission applications pending.

Please note that five applicants have applied for more than one type of executive clemency. This report accounts for each type of clemency requested as a separate application.

I granted the following pardons:

Abbas Moradi. Convicted of Promoting Prostitution on August 8, 1989. Sentenced to 36 months' probation and to pay fines. Since completing his probation, Mr. Moradi has demonstrated a profound commitment to serving vulnerable populations within his community by operating an adult foster care facility that provides care for severely disabled Oregonians. He has been a law-abiding citizen of this State, and has lived a crime-free life for over twenty-five years.

Timothy Neal Haner. Convicted of Manufacture/Deliver Controlled Substance on July 27, 1994. Sentenced to serve 36 months' probation. Since completing his probation, Mr. Haner has been a law abiding citizen, has lived a crime-free life for over twenty years, and has been a valuable member of his community. The Multnomah County District Attorney supported Mr. Haner's pardon and acknowledged Mr. Haner's cooperation and personal positive pro-social values.

Brandon Scott Buschbach. Convicted of Criminal Driving While Suspended or Revoked on June 4, 1991. Sentenced to serve 24 months' probation and to pay fines. The Clackamas County District Attorney did not oppose Mr. Buschbach's pardon. Since completing his probation, Mr. Buschbach has demonstrated a commitment to public service through personal sacrifice by serving honorably in the Oregon National Guard with deployments to Afghanistan and Iraq.

Leonel Sandoval. Convicted of Manufacture/Deliver Controlled Substance on May 8, 1998. Sentenced to 60 days in custody and 24 months' probation. Since completing his probation, Mr. Sandoval has completed substance abuse treatment and has not been convicted of any other crime. In 2014, Mr. Sandoval was awarded the Civilian Medal of Heroism by the City of Portland for saving the life of a suicidal person. In addition Mr. Sandoval has contributed to the community by coaching his children's athletic teams, assisting elderly families with repairs to their homes, and donating time and items to Scappoose Thrift.
