Average time to become licensed:

Current license processing time is just over two weeks. From spring through September, license processing can take 5-6 weeks due to increased numbers of program completers and district hiring needs.

Regarding how long it takes a candidate to complete a program, the many variable involved make any estimation of time to completion limited in usefulness. Some of the variables include:

- The type of license sought (counseling takes longer)
- Previous candidate higher education and work experience
- Time since last higher education coursework (which may impact success on licensing exams)
- Availability for candidate to pay for part-time versus full-time study
- Work, family responsibilities that may limit amount of coursework to be taken in any given term
- Previous licensing
- Whether candidate is able to demonstrate content mastery prior to matriculation

Graduate level licensing programs are generally designed to be completed within 1-2 years of full time study.

Undergraduate programs can generally be completed within the standard four-year period; however, many of the barriers faced by other undergraduates can also impact license program completion time. Actual completion times may be closer to five years. Financial barriers often challenge candidates, particularly the candidates we most seek in diversifying the teaching workforce. Another substantial barrier has been that many candidates may have lost credit when transferring from community college or may require remedial credit to meet prerequisites for certain courses or better prepare to pass content exams or other program entry requirements.

Oregon Educator Preparation Providers:

A list of Oregon's 16 approved educator preparation providers is attached. Graduate programs (G) generally are 1-2 years of full-time study Undergraduate programs are generally completed within 4-5 years.


Types of programs, e.g. 2-year versus 1-year programs:

A list of licenses, endorsements, and specializations offered by Oregon EPPs is attached.

Advanced level credentials (administration, counseling) and certain specialized areas such as special education and early intervention/early childhood special education may also require longer completion times.

Number of graduates (completers) from each program:¹

A program completer is defined as a person who has met all the requirements of a state-approved teacher preparation program. Program completers include all those who are documented as having met such requirements. Documentation may take the form of a degree, institutional certificate, program credential, transcript or other written proof of having met the program's requirements. In applying this definition, the fact that an individual has or has not been recommended to the state for an initial credential may not be used as a criterion for determining who is a program completer.
