

During the 2015-2017 biennium, just under \$1.75 million dollars has been awarded to fund nine CTE Summer Program Grants. Programs are supported by schools, school districts, Education Service Districts, and Community Colleges. Summer programs align with existing CTE Programs of Study at the high school. The purpose of the grant is to create opportunities for students that:

- Provide regional access to summer CTE programs focused on the needs of historically underserved students.
- Provide state-of-the-art CTE facilities, training, and mentoring that is not otherwise available during the regular school day at the local school.
- Provide summer short-term and exploratory regional CTE instruction for middle school students.
- Provide advanced CTE students in grades 10 through 12 with intensive study addressing academic and technical attainment that could lead to an industry credential and/or college credit.

 - 1233 high school students
 - 896 middle school students


Each grant recipient will offer at least one middle school and one high school program each summer for two summers.
