

## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Serving in the Oregon House of Representatives is a humbling experience. As a first-term legislator I am working hard to learn how structures and systems function: listening a lot, speaking a little. Despite some difficult events over the past few weeks, we are working together as a team to ensure robust conversation about the issues that matter most.

Each day I am amazed at the energy, enthusiasm, and passion of so many people working to make Oregon a better, stronger community. Whatever the respective partisan differences, all ninety members are united in our belief that Oregon is a special place that has a bright future. It is often forgotten that a majority of the votes pass the House of Representatives have little if no opposition. That is the result of a collaborative committee-based approach that encourages us to put our ideas on the table and work together for a positive outcome.

I invite you to come to your Capitol and join the process. It is exciting time: all committees are working full-speed to review bills assigned; we have voted on several so far, but we have over 3,000 more to evaluate. I ask you to pass on your ideas and perspectives on the bills we are considering. This session I have been assigned to the Business and Labor, Human Services and Housing, and the Veterans' and Emergency Preparedness Committees. Most of my time will be focused on these issues, but I hope to facilitate meaningful discussions about the matters as they arise. At the end of the day, this seventy-eight Legislative Session will pass a budget, make new laws, and work on providing our citizens with the tools necessary for navigating the challenges of a slow but steady recovery.

In coming newsletters I will provide you updates from the Capitol. Our schedule is about to move to a daily floor session which is a sign that things are accelerating. We have until the beginning of July to complete the people's business. In other words, we have a lot of work to do in a short amount of time. With your help and input we can – and will – make responsible decisions and sound public policy.
