**Rep. Lynn Findley announces committee assignments and priorities for 2018
Legislative Session**

Newest member of the Oregon House already making an impact in Salem

Salem, Ore. - In just his second week as a member of the Oregon Legislature, State Representative Lynn Findley (R-Vale) is already making an impact in the State Capitol. Rep. Findley has sponsored three bills on issues ranging from carbon sequestration and forest management to judicial fairness, and will serve on several key legislative committees through the 2018 session.

"Having taken the oath of office just over a week ago, I feel fortunate to already be in a position to make an impact in the Legislature," said Rep. Findley. "For this session, I will be serving on the Energy & Environment Committee as well as the Revenue Committee. Serving on these committees will give me an up close look at some of the most important issues being discussed this session. I am also excited to have sponsored several bills that I believe will make a positive difference in House District 60 and communities around the state."

As a member of the House Energy and Environment Committee, Rep. Findley will be asked to study policies like the carbon tax and other environment policies. On the Revenue Committee, Rep. Findley will get the first look at any tax legislation being considered by lawmakers.

In addition to playing an active role on these committees, Rep. Findley has so far sponsored three bills for the 2018 session, including:

- [HB 4109](#), which promotes carbon sequestration through better forest management policy;
- [HB 4008](#), promoting judicial fairness through plaintiff's damages protection
- [HB 4153](#), designating Eastern Oregon University as Oregon's Rural University

"I'm working hard to get these bills to the Governor's desk," said Rep. Findley. "I believe these are good policies that would improve the quality of life for Oregonians around the state. I am hopeful that I will have the opportunity to sign on to additional legislation before the end of the session."

Representative Lynn Findley represents House District 60, which includes residents in Malheur, Baker, Harney, Grant and part of Lake Counties.
