Rep. David Gomberg Applauds OSU Newport Funding in Governor's Budget Proposal

NEWPORT—Governor John Kitzhaber's recently released budget proposal for Oregon's 2015-17 biennium includes funding for construction of the planned OSU Newport campus at the current site of the OSU Hatfield Marine Science Center in South Beach. The university has requested \$25 million in state bonding authority to support the \$55 million project cost.

"This remarkable expansion of our Marine Studies program will place Oregon squarely in the forefront of ocean and climate science research worldwide. Confirming the construction funds is a real step forward for OSU, for Newport and all of Lincoln County." said State Rep. David Gomberg (D-Otis).

"The Governor's Budget includes \$322.5 million in general obligation bonds for 14 capital projects at the seven public universities. This includes \$275.4 million in bonds that will be repaid with General Fund. Projects include increased funding for capital renewal, renovation of Neuberger Hall at Portland State University, the initial phase of an expansion of the Oregon State University Marine Studies Campus in Newport, construction of a Learning and Innovation Hub for the University of Oregon School of Architecture and Applied Arts, and others."

"The 500 upper-division students and 100-plus high-paid faculty and staff will be a real shot in the arm to our economy year-round," Gomberg added. "I have been involved with OSU since my time as student body president in the 1970's and this is truly one of the most exciting developments I've witnessed in all that time. I would like to thank President Ray, Dr. Cowen, the OSU Foundation board, and Governor Kitzhaber for coming together on this historic project."

Gomberg, along with his colleagues in the Oregon Coastal Caucus, have been vocal supporters of the OSU expansion since its inception. The legislature is set to vote on a budget by July of next year.
