

# KEEPING OREGONIANS SAFE

Every Oregonian deserves to feel safe, which means holding offenders accountable, supporting victims, addressing homelessness, preventing gun violence, keeping communities clean, and investing in climate resilience through wildfire prevention and emergency preparedness.

## **To improve community safety, Oregon Democrats:**

- Added stronger penalties for those dealing fentanyl (SB 236)
- Equipped patients to make informed decisions about the potential use of opioids (HB 3211)
- Cracked down on illicit massage parlors that participate in human trafficking (HB 3819)
- Ensured campus security officers receive a background check (HB 2551)
- Allowed rental guests to sue innkeepers or landlords who take photos, record videos or audio of them in private areas (SB 470)
- Supported students recovering from brain injuries (HB 3007)
- Passed \$707M budget to address the public defense crisis (HB 5031)
- Reformed Oregon's mental health laws to expand treatment and speed care for those unfit to stand trial (HB 2005)

## **To protect victims of crime, Oregon Democrats:**

- Updated the qualifications for statutes of limitation so victims of child abuse or sexual assault can seek justice (HB 3582)
- Banned sharing intimate images made by AI or other editing software and outlawed sending unsolicited lewd images (HB 2299, HB 3766)
- Made clear that domestic violence is a crime that cannot be merged with other charges (HB 2975)
- Required health care settings to track and implement violence-prevention procedures for incidents of workplace violence (SB 537)

## **To prevent gun violence, Oregon Democrats:**

- Banned the transport, manufacture or selling of rapid fire activators that have been seen in mass shooting events across the country (SB 243)
