Washington County Commissioners Appoint Nathan Sosa to House District 30

Salem, Ore. -- Today Washington County commissioners appointed Nathan Sosa as Representative-designate for House District 30, filling the seat vacated by <u>Senator Janeen Sollman</u> (D-Hillsboro).

Sosa will be sworn in on February 1, the first day of the 2022 legislative session, at 7:30 a.m.

"I'm honored to represent the people of House District 30 and look forward to championing policies that help working families," said Representative-designate Sosa. "As someone who was raised by a single mom in a working-class family, I've experienced the struggles that so many people are going through now."

Sosa lives and works in Hillsboro. He has been an attorney since 2009. He previously served as chair of the Oregon Ethics Commission and is president of the Hillsboro Schools Foundation.

"I wish to congratulate Nathan Sosa on his appointment to fill the vacant seat for House District 30. Nathan brings an exciting lens of experience volunteering and organizing community support in the Hillsboro area for several years," said Sen. Sollman. "He is ready to serve and will be a strong addition to the Oregon House. I look forward to working alongside him to serve the people of our district and all Oregonians."

Since 2017, Sosa has served as co-chair of Oregon Trial Lawyers' Minority Caucus where he has spearheaded outreach initiatives to law students. He is also a youth mentor.

"With his proven track-record as a community leader, experience as a lawyer, and drive to help working Oregonians, Representative-designate Sosa is ready to hit the ground running this session. We're excited to welcome him to our Caucus," said House Majority Leader Julie Fahey (D-West Eugene/Junction City).
