## Pain At The Pump: How Much Will SB 324 Cost Oregonians?

If the Oregon House of Representatives votes to pass SB 324 today, Oregonians will be faced with higher gas prices and slimmer budgets. The Department of Environmental Quality has said the Low Carbon Fuel Standard will lead to an increase of 4 cents - 19 cents per gallon of fuel, while industry experts believe prices could increase as much as \$1.06 per gallon.
