## **Representative Bill Kennemer To Serve On Campaign Finance Reform Task Force**

**Salem, Ore.** - Representative Bill Kennemer (R-Canby) has been appointed by legislative leadership to serve on the Legislature's Campaign Finance Reform Task Force. The task force's main objective is to examine the current campaign finance structure in Oregon and make recommendations to the Legislature about future reforms.

"Reforming our campaign finance system and improving transparency has always been one of my top priorities as a lawmaker," said Rep. Kennemer, who also serves on the House Rules Committee which often focuses on election related laws. "I'm pleased to have an opportunity to serve on this task force, and to be a part of a group that is committed to improving transparency and making sure our campaign finance system works for Oregonians."

Throughout his career, Representative Kennemer has introduced several campaign finance related bills, with a particular focus on disclosure and transparency related to financing. He will attend his first meeting as a member of the Campaign Finance Task Force on Thursday, May 26, 2016.

In addition to serving on the Joint Task Force on Campaign Finance Reform, Rep. Kennemer serves on the Access to Natural Gas Work Group, Schedules that Work Work Group, Prescription Drug Cost/Pricing Work Group, Compact of Free Association (COFA) Health Insurance Advisory Group, as well as the House Business & Labor Committee, House Health Care Committee, House Rules Committee, and the Joint Committee on Ballot measure 93.

Rep. Kennemer is serving his fourth term as a member of the Oregon House. House District 39 covers the greater Barlow, Barton, Beavercreek, Boring, Canby, Carus, Charbonneau, Eagle Creek, Estacada, Fishers Mill, Mulino and Redland areas, as well as portions of Damascus, Happy Valley, and rural Oregon City.
