STATE CAPITOL TO RE-OPEN MONDAY WITH ADJUSTED SCHEDULE

*CAPITOL WILL OPEN AT 8 A.M.; MORNING HOUSE COMMITTEES AND FLOOR SESSION
POSTPONED TO ENSURE SAFETY*

SALEM – The Oregon State Capitol is expected to re-open at 8 a.m. Monday morning as weather and travel conditions continue to improve in and around Salem. House Speaker Tina Kotek announced that while the House of Representatives is expected to return to business, a number of morning committee meetings and the house floor session will be postponed in order to ensure safety of those traveling to Salem.

The House Business and Labor and Higher Education and Workforce Development committees, normally scheduled for 8 a.m. will be delayed until 5:30 p.m. Monday evening. The Joint Ways and Means Subcommittee on Education, previously scheduled for 8:30 a.m. will be canceled.

The house floor session will convene briefly at 4:45 p.m. in order to advance legislative business, but will not hold any floor votes.

Committees scheduled for 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. Monday will meet as planned.
