Program Overview

The Senate Republican Fellowship is offered by the Senate Republican Office during the Winter and Spring semesters, from January 12 to June 5. Fellows will work in the Senate Republican Office. Full-time and part-time opportunities are available.

Fellows receive a stipend of \$500 per month (for full-time; prorated for part-time) and can earn college, graduate, or law school credit if allowed by their school. Up to four fellows will be selected.

Description of Position

Fellows will acquire experience in public policy and communication, build marketable skills, work with experts on many topics, gain a comprehensive understanding of the legislative process, build a strong network, and have at least two strong writing samples by the end.

Working 20-40 hours a week, fellows will conduct research; write bill summaries, memos, talking points, and press releases; attend events and committee hearings; track bill progress; prepare amendments; communicate with legislators, state agencies, lobbyists, advocates, and the public; and help constituents. Fellows are supervised and mentored by legislative staff and attend weekly group mentorship breakfasts with key state leaders. Specific duties vary, depending on fellowship assignments, but all fellows will be in the midst of the action, taking part in the crafting of legislation in a fast-paced environment.

Eligibility

Oregon ties are strongly preferred but not required. All applicants must be: (1) Juniors or Seniors in a Bachelor's degree program; (2) Law or Graduate students; or (3) recent college or advanced degree graduates. All applicants must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0, demonstrate academic excellence, and have an interest in public service.

The position requires strong communication and writing skills, the ability to work in a team setting, and confidence to be a self-starter and take initiative. Fellows do not have to be political science majors or know anything about the legislative process; your supervisors will teach you everything you need to know. The most important attributes of a fellow are enthusiasm, a willingness to learn through hands-on experience, and interest in the legislative process. Students from all academic disciplines are encouraged to apply.

Application Timeline

Preference will be given to those who apply before the initial review of applications on December 15, but consideration will continue on a rolling basis until fellows start January 12.
