# **Uninsured for Health Care**

Below are several charts on demographic information about uninsured Oregonians. Data for these charts is taken from <u>Oregon's Uninsured: Analysis of the 2008</u> <u>American Community Survey, May 2010</u> prepared by Dr. Jeanene Smith, Tina Edlund, Sean Kolmer, Elyssa Tran, Jay Grussing, Mary Dinsdale, Shawna Kennedy-Walters of the Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research (OHPR). Roughly 45 million Americans or 15.1 percent of the nation lacked health insurance in 2008. There is large variation in uninsurance rates between states; Massachusetts' 4.2 percent is the lowest and Texas' 24.1 percent is the highest. Oregon's 16.5 percent (out of a population of roughly 3.7 million civilian non-institutionalized individuals) is worse than in 34 other states. Among those with health insurance, private insurance covers the vast majority of Oregonians with 2.6 million residents covered.

### **Oregon's Context**

Oregon's uninsured rate of 16.5 percent was significantly higher than the national average of 15.1 percent, and Washington average of 13.2 percent. However, Oregon's uninsurance rate is similar to its other neighbors.

#### **Oregon's Health Insurance Coverage** by Age

Most children and working age adults have private health insurance, while the vast majority of seniors have insurance through the public Medicare program. Working-age adults, given they are the vast majority of Oregon's population, represent the largest number of uninsured Oregonians. Roughly one in five working age adults lacked health insurance in 2008.

#### **Regional Health Insurance Coverage Estimates**

The largest uninsured populations by region are Region 13 - Central Multnomah County, Region 15 – primarily Washington County, and Region 11 - Marion County. Additional estimates of health insurance for working aged adults (19-64) and children (0-18) reflected a similar geographical pattern where higher populations equated to higher numbers of uninsured. However, the opposite is true in terms of rates, with rural areas displaying higher uninsured rates compared to urban areas.




#### **Race and Ethnicity**

Many of Oregon's racial and ethnic minority populations lack health insurance at rates greater than Oregon's average. In 2008, the state's average was 16.5 percent.



#### Percent Uninsured by Race, 2008

Oregon's Hispanic/Latino population had an uninsurance rate of 35.1% percent, which was more than double those who were non-Hispanic (14.2 percent). Oregon had nearly 144,000 Hispanics without health insurance, the 13th highest rate of uninsured Hispanics/Latinos in the country.
