**Statement From Representative Mike McLane Regarding Snow  
Emergency In Crook County**

**Salem, Ore.** - House Republican Leader and House District 55 State Representative Mike McLane (R-Powell Butte) issued the following statement regarding the [snow emergency in Crook County](#):

“I have been closely monitoring the situation in Crook County and specifically in Juniper Acres. My office has been in contact with constituents in the community and in frequent communication with Crook County Judge Seth Crawford, who is on the frontlines of this situation. My office has also been in contact with the Governor's office, the Oregon Department of Transportation and the Office of Emergency Management, who have assured me they are taking this emergency very seriously and have committed to me that they have a plan in place for assisting residents who may be in danger.

“At this time, I want to reiterate many of the calls from local officials who have been urging Oregonians to take every precaution when traveling and to check in on the welfare of their friends and neighbors as winter conditions persist. With more snow in the forecast and freezing temperatures expected to continue, Oregonians should not hesitate to contact emergency personnel if they or someone they know is in distress.

“I also want to extend a thank you to the public servants and volunteers who continue to work around the clock to keep Oregonians safe in these dangerous conditions.”
