

# Notice of Work- Hazardous Materials Testing

To: Capitol Building

From: Oregon State Capitol Renovation (OSCR) Team

### The following OSCR project team members will be working in the Capitol:

#### Scheduled Date and Time of Work:

- The testing is scheduled to begin on Monday, April 27th
- Most of the testing will be conducted during non-business hours, from 6:00 p.m. 6:00 a.m.
- Testing in the facility storage closets will be done during normal business hours
- The work is scheduled to be completed by May 11th, 2015

#### Location of work:

- Testing will be done on floors G, 2, 3 and 4 of the 1938 building
- Specific testing locations are as follows:

  - o Southeast and Southwest Stairwell on Ground Floor
  - Room 65- Capitol Club Conference Room
  - Room 43- Capitol Press Room
  - Room 49- Facility Services

  - o Conference Room 243
  - o Room 357- House Republican Caucus Room
  - Room 335- Committee Services
  - o Room 454- Committee Services

  - Select facility storage closets on floors G, 3, and 4

## Work to be performed:

- Team members will be testing for hazardous materials such as asbestos, lead paint and polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) and Mercury Vapor light tubes in various locations throughout the 1938 building
- Testing involves identifying and obtaining samples of various building materials and components

### Impacts:

- Team members will be escorted by a Facility Services representative while the work is being conducted.
- There will be very minimal noise impacts, as the team will not be using noisy equipment to collect their samples.
- Work will be conducted at night to avoid disruption to the normal daily activities of the Legislature
- You may notice some areas where a 2 inch square of paint is missing. Samples will be taken in discreet locations when possible.

### Purpose of work:

• This work is being done to determine whether or not lead and/ or asbestos is present in these locations.
