

Secretary: Vote explanation please. Senator Boquist

“SB 266 is a statutory attempt to cover up and transfer liability for the death of seniors in homes and centers as ordered by the Governor. As the Carrier stated on the Floor, the majority of Oregon’s symptomatic covid-19 deaths are and were in senior homes, centers and living facilities. This is recorded in the official record of the Floor Session. Seniors are known to be factually the most vulnerable to SARS-CoV-2 but were locked up and last for treatment or remedies. As the Carrier stated families were blocked by the Governor from helping their fathers, mothers, and lived ones trapped behind her Executive Orders backed by Judges and armed police. Governor Kate Brown, OHA Director Allen, OHA Doctor Sidelinger, OHA, DHH, and OSHA as agencies are responsible for these deaths. There is no ‘superior order’ defense by these officials. Meaning they and law enforcement cannot claim they were simply following orders. It is intentional manslaughter under Oregon Revised Statutes. It is a crime against humanity. OHA and DHS have long been considered incompetent in the legislature with one bail out and change after the next. SB 266 style reforms ten fold are required as the bill simply attempts to deflect blame, liability, and criminal responsibility by saying we have no law or rules thus must make them in the future. False. The final amendments came out of the dark of the night from the Democrat Chair hours before passage as committee members have explained elsewhere, and is recorded in the public record on OLIS. The facilities themselves may or may not be responsible given state bureaucrats and law enforcement alike have been used by the Governor to enforce these deaths, while, Judges stood by or gave their blessing themselves.
