Daylight Saving Time bill against ticking clock
Post urges Legislature to move quickly

SALEM, Ore.—[Senate Bill 320](#), the Daylight Saving Time bill, and the resolution [Senate Joint Memorial 6](#) are sitting in the House Rules Committee, which is open until the last day of session, June 30th. Oregon lawmakers are coordinating with Washington and California on our year-round Daylight Saving Time bills and do not want to be the outlier.

Washington's bill HB 1196 was [signed into law on May 8th](#). The California State Assembly passed their DST bill (AB 7) 72-0 last week. Note, they have until September to finish their work on this bill. British Columbia is also working on permanent Daylight Saving.

Rep. Bill Post, R-Keizer, released the following statement:

“This has been a great, bipartisan effort, and we don’t want to fall behind. Ditching the switch is good for our public health and safety, our economy and we need to be aligned with the rest of our region.”
