Multipartisan anger mounts against HB 3063 *Post urges sponsors kill the bill*

SALEM, Ore.—Multipartisan anger is mounting against a bill cloaked in secrecy to mandate forcible injections as a condition of entering public spaces. State Rep. Bill Post, R-Keizer, Tuesday called for the bill sponsors to take off their names from House Bill 3063 and to focus on real emergencies facing the state like the foster system crisis and the education and PERS crisis that threatens children's futures. Post also gave a thumbs-up to a package of amendments from state Sen. Kim Thatcher, R-Keizer, that included forcibly injecting members who vote for the bill, the governor and their families if the bill is signed into law.

Post released the following statement:

"We can all agree there are real emergencies facing our state, and House Bill 3063 is a distraction. I'm urging my colleagues to either adopt amendments that are headed their way from Sen. Thatcher's office, or drop their names from the bill. This is a simple issue: if we care about kids and emergencies, let's focus on the real ones. I've heard from thousands of Oregonians from all political parties—they hate this bill."
