# NCSL Redistricting Update – April 15, 2021

### Alabama v. Department of Commerce

As many of you know, Alabama filed a <u>lawsuit</u> challenging the Census Bureau's implementation of <u>differential privacy</u> and the delayed release of 2020 census data. On Monday, the federal judge allowed <u>sixteen states</u> to file amici curiae briefs in support of Alabama's challenge to the Bureau's use of differential privacy, a mathematical method that would inject noise to the census data to protect privacy. Other amici briefs have been filed in this case in support of both parties.

On Tuesday, the Department of Commerce and the Census Bureau filed its response and other documents: <u>Defendants' response without appendices</u>; <u>Defendants' response with appendices</u> (including a declaration from John Abowd); <u>declaration of James Whitehorne</u>; and <u>declaration of Michael Thieme</u>.
