The 2020 Census numbers have now been reformatted and loaded into the [redistricting application](#). This application can be used by the public to draw and submit maps for consideration by the redistricting committees. The 2020 Census redistricting data provided the first detailed counts and characteristics of the population for local geographies. This article discusses how the bureau compared the 2020 Census results to key population data benchmarks (the official population estimates of the April 1, 2020, population and the 2010 Census) to assess the quality of the 2020 Census Redistricting Data (P.L. 94-171) Summary File. The bureau found that the redistricting data is comparable to the examined population benchmarks.
