Founded in 2017, the mission of the Oregon Legislative Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) Caucus is to advance racial justice initiatives and eliminate systemic oppression and racism in Oregon. We envision an Oregon that is racially diverse, dynamic, just, and thriving.

With the largest BIPOC Caucus in state history, the caucus is presented with the unique opportunity to pursue its mission and provide greater representation to historically underserved and underrepresented communities in the Oregon State Capitol.

Legislative Accomplishments

The BIPOC Caucus celebrates major victories that center racial equity and a reality where every person, no matter their background, is valued, supported, and treated with dignity. Legislative accomplishments include:

Caucus Priorities Already Signed Into Law

 Prohibiting housing discrimination based on immigration status (SB 599)

Caucus Priorities Adopted into Budget Bills

- Ensuring the fundamental right to due process by providing immigration legal services (Universal Representation)
- Continuing key efforts to narrow Oregon's language access gap for Indigenous speakers, strengthening the existing interpretation workforce
- Creating a relief fund to support farmworkers who have lost income due to extreme weather conditions
- Funding a culturally responsive violence prevention program, directly serving youth and families impacted by violence (East Multnomah Outreach Prevention Intervention)

Caucus Priorities on the Governor's Desk

- Directing the Public Utility Commission to consider economic impact on Oregonians when increasing utility rates (HB 3179)
- Requiring a study on current workplace protections for farmworkers (HB 2548)
