Likewise, I did not receive any positive from my District Attorneys. At the same time, I sought legal interpretations from Legislative Counsel as the common word of the law on page 2, lines 19-20, start out with "Sexual contact or sexual intercourse... between a child over 12 years of age and a person under 21 years of age..." leads a reasonable person to believe the age of consent is being lowered to 12 years old. Nothing from Legislative Counsel really changed that interpretation. A Committee Member said the intent was to prevent abuse reporting for dancing or making out or kissing. LC provide me in writing the definition of 'sexual contact' verbatim out of ORS 163.305 which does not include dancing, kissing or making out. I specifically asked about changes to the criminal code in both offense and defense. The offense charges are not changed but according to Legislative Counsel the bill creates an affirmative defense for consensual sexual intercourse down to the age of 12 years. The two exceptions to the 12 year old sexual intercourse consent is an age difference of 3 years or mental health status. I was told by a Committee Member this bill was aligning with federal law. Again, LC differed in that a federal law exists allowing Oregon to choose that 12 year old's can consent to health treatment without parental consent to include contraceptives or other medical treatments which of course includes abortions etc. Again, medical treatments which of course includes abortions etc. Again, Oregon is choosing this option under federal law as it is not a requirement. Last Friday, 17-18 year old students in Joint Student Success Committee discussed a length bullying, coercion, etc being unchecked in schools so how a 12 year old is not going to be coerced out of fear to claim consensual sex is beyond reason. This bill should have addressed the issue at the SKSD not broke new ground that in my mind is severely flawed. Unfortunately, may citizens in my Senate District will see this as reducing the age of sexual consent to 12 years of age. They will compare Oregon to Alabama for better or worse. It is now clear to me with the passage of SB 1540, that the majority in the State Senate must not grasp the true situation in Oregon schools, or at least, are not willing to address it in a bi-partisan manner. It certainly makes the remote success of the new joint education committee questionable.

HB 4145 contains three major parts; improving communications on intentionally attempted illegal background checks, an attempt at closing the 'boyfriend' loophole, and adding generic stalking to the list that prohibits possession of a firearm. Note legislative counsel says the 'ammunition' portion of existing law is unenforceable. The House repaired portions of the background check communications issue at my request communicated to the Governor's Office. However, like on the last days of the 2017 Session, by majority vote, No funds were provided to the OSP to carry out either reporting or investigations to allow for prosecution. The Senate Democrats again today did not want to add the funds necessary for actual prosecution. The 'boyfriend' loophole does not appear to be any tighter under HB 4145 but instead possibility worse. Existing law uses 'intimate partner' which is the exact verbatim situation used as an example by the Carrier. That is existing law the failed. The US Attorney General's Office provides a definition of 'intimate partner that is not wide enough to fully encompass the common term desired for the 'boyfriend' loophole. Legislative Counsel says 'intimate partner' is a federal legal term not used in Oregon yet it is existing Oregon law being eliminated in HB 4145. Legislative Counsel then says 'family or household member' in HB 4145 will not be interpreted as words by Judges. Said differently, 'family or household members' in the bill will not be used by Judges in determining who the law applies too. Very strange give four consecutive Supreme Court Chief Justices have stated the 'word of the law' is what they utilize. It is very likely since the bill does not spell out the exact definition as requested that the bill will expand who is included household as being potentially banned from

firearm ownership BUT actually narrow the reach of existing 'intimate partners' i.e. boyfriends from existing law. The law should have spelled out exactly the definition and intent. Believe we will be back redefining the definition of 'boyfriend' is the 2019 Session. Lastly, the stalking portion of the bill is not ready for prime time. I had numerous meetings with the Governor's Office trying to reach a consensus on the bill. Unfortunately, the boyfriend definition was not fixes nor was the stalking problem.

It would seem logical to wait for university spending until the Joint Student Success Committee determine the best way forward. Unless of course the Student Success is a farce. It is further noted, last Session we did not fund a badly needed railroad spur at Umatilla Army Depot but it missed the list. The good news to me is we did fund other merited projects from last Session. The bill required 16 votes for passage. It also required some No votes to help make the dark of the night Democrat process for developing the list become transparent in the future.

It is seriously over weighted with dollars to universities. The same universities who cannot control their own costs. The same universities who keep increasing student tuition and fees. The same universities who are creating lifetime debts for graduates. Instead of graduating with hope the students graduate with a huge debt plus many lack the job skills necessary to get a job. This has been a four decade decline of student success under Democrat leadership or lack thereof. Universities have completely failed to transition to the 21st Century students, so like K-12, must be reformed or collapse financially. It would seem logical to wait for university spending until the Joint Student Success Committee determines the best way forward. Student Success was to address teacher issues thus teacher education issues. The bill required 16 votes for passage. It also required some No votes to help make the next Session come to it's senses.
