Dear Senator Roblan:

You have contacted to Oregon Government Ethics Commission regarding a re-occurring event known as the Oregon Coast Economic Summit. You have requested written guidance regarding how the provisions in Oregon Government Ethics law may apply to public officials who may wish to participate in a fact-finding mission, during which food and beverage will be provided at the 2014 Annual Oregon Coast Economic Summit.

The Oregon Coastal Caucus is holding a two day event scheduled for August 20 & 21, 2014. This year's theme, "Strengthening Our Region through Collaboration: A Confluence of Economic and Institutional Factors for Regional Economic Development" which will address the impact of state and federal policies on the economic development challenges faced by rural and coastal communities. During this event at the Three Rivers Casino & Hotel, the Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians will provide and pay for meals.

Invited participants will include legislators as well as a variety of others that represent economic development from various state and local jurisdictions. The purpose of this event is to educate and inform state and local government officials as well as regional stakeholders regarding matters affecting the current economic conditions facing Oregon's rural and coastal communities. Those who participate will be provided food and beverage expenses.

This letter of advice addresses how the provisions of ORS Chapter 244 may apply to public officials who participate in the proposed event. Under most circumstances, when a public official is offered food or beverage at no cost to the public official, it would be a gift as defined in ORS 244.020(6)(a).

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If the provider of a gift to a public official has a legislative or administrative interest in the votes or decisions of the public official there are conditions and restrictions that apply to the acceptance of the gift. A legislative or administrative interest is defined in ORS 244.020(9) as an economic interest that is distinct from the economic interest held by members of the general public in the votes or decisions of the public official.

The food and beverage provided to the public officials would be considered a gift as defined in ORS 244.020(6)(a). ORS 244.020(6)(b)(F) allows acceptance of reasonable expenses paid by any unit of the federal government, a state or local government, a Native American tribe that is recognized by federal law or formally acknowledged by a state, a membership organization to which a public body as defined in ORS 174.109 pays membership dues or a not-for-profit corporation that is tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, for attendance at a convention, fact-finding mission or trip, conference or other meeting if the public official is scheduled to deliver a speech, make a presentation, participate on a panel or represent state government as defined in ORS 174.11, a local government as defined in ORS 174.116 or a special government body as defined in ORS 171.117.

Based on the information provided, food and beverage is being provided by the Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians for public officials to participate in what appears to be a fact-finding mission, therefore ORS 244.020(6)(b)(F) would apply.

The public officials who participate in the event and who must file an Annual Verified Statement of Economic Interest form with the Oregon Government Ethics Commission would be required to report the aggregate value of these paid expenses pursuant to ORS 244.060(5) if they exceed \$50.00. The Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, the source of the paid expenses, is required to provide a detailed cost analysis of the aggregate value of expenses paid on their behalf for filing purposes within 10 days after the date the expenses are incurred [ORS 244.100((1))].

Representative Caddy McKeown, *D-Coos Bay, HD 9, Chair, Coastal Caucus.*

Representative Caddy McKeown was born and raised in Coos Bay. She served on the Board of Commissioners of the Oregon International Port of Coos Bay for nine years where she worked to rehabilitate the Coos Bay rail line before being elected to represent coastal portions of Coos, Douglas, Lane and Lincoln counties in the Oregon House of Representatives in 2012. Rep. McKeown is a member of the House Transportation & Economic Development committee, the Ways & Means Joint Subcommittee on Transportation & Economic Development and the House Agriculture & Natural Resources committee. She is also a member of the House Small Business Task Force, the House Task Force on O & C Counties and the Legislative Commission on Indian Services.



Senator Jeff Kruse, *R-Roseburg, SD 1, Vice-Chair, Coastal Caucus.*

Senator Kruse first served in the Oregon House of Representatives from 1996 to 2004, specializing in natural resources and health care. Currently in his third term as Senator, he serves on the Health Care, Education, and Judiciary committees. The Senator is considered the leading Republican voice in the Senate in the areas of health care and education and is currently the Coastal Caucus Vice-Chair. Co-Owner of Kruse Farms, Senator Kruse's prior government experience includes Douglas Soil and Water Conservation District, Oregon Association of Conservation Districts, Farm Home Administration County Committee, and Douglas County Planning Advisory Committee.



Representative Deborah Boone, *D-Cannon Beach, HD 32*

Representative Boone has served in the Oregon House of Representatives since 2004. She serves as Vice-Chair for the House Committees on Energy & Environment and on Veterans Services & Emergency Preparedness. Her government experience also includes sixteen years as a legislative assistant, Clatsop County Commission, PNWER, OSSPAC, PFLTF and many other legislative boards and commissions, including her work on marine renewable energy projects. She co-owns a small construction company in rural Clatsop County.



Senator Arnie Roblan, *D-Coos Bay, SD 5*

Senator Arnie Roblan represents the scenic and rugged central Oregon coast comprising the 5th Senate District. Senator Roblan previously served four terms as Representative for House District 9 (2005-12), with two of those as Co-Speaker of the House. Senator Roblan received the Milken Education Award in 1997 and in 2012, the Oregon Business Association award for Statesman of the Year in recognition of his extraordinary achievements for public service, consensus building, and forging collaborative solutions to critical issues.



Representative Wayne Krieger, *R-Gold Beach, HD 1*

Representative Krieger was a member of the Oregon State Police for almost 28 years and has served in the Oregon House of Representatives since 2001. Rep. Krieger also served on the Oregon Board of Forestry, the Landslide Taskforce, and the Governor's Water Enhancement Board, and in Washington D.C. on the national boards of the Tree Farm System and the Forest Industries Council on Taxation. The Representative owns Skyview Ranch and Tree Farm and previously owned a logging company for 11 years. Rep. Krieger received tree-farming awards from Coos County, the state of Oregon, and was recognized as National Tree Farmer of the Year.



Senator Doug Whitsett, *R-Klamath Falls, SD 28*

Since 2005, Senator Whitsett has served Senate District 28, which includes Klamath, Lake, Crook, and parts of Jackson and Deschutes counties. Sen. Whitsett is the past president of the Oregon Veterinary Medical Association and the Klamath County Cattlemen's Association. Sen. Whitsett currently owns and operates two small farms in the Klamath basin with his wife and has authored articles in several publications.



Senator Betsy Johnson, D-Scappoose, SD 16

Senator Johnson is serving her second term in the Oregon Senate. Sen. Johnson received her undergraduate degree in history from Carleton College and her J.D. from Lewis & Clark Law School. A licensed commercial pilot of both fixed and rotor-wing aircraft, she founded Transwestern Helicopters, Inc., in 1978. Sen. Johnson has served on numerous local, regional and national boards and commissions, including the Oregon Health Sciences University Foundation, Doernbecher Children's Hospital, the Oregon Public Broadcasting Foundation and the High Desert Museum. Sen. Johnson currently serves on

a number of regional boards, most recently elected as a member of the Board of Visitors, Lewis & Clark Law School. She also serves as the president of the Samuel S. Johnson Foundation.



Representative David Gomberg, D-Otis, HD 10

Serving his first term in the Oregon Legislature, Representative Gomberg represents the Central Oregon Coast and the communities of the Coastal Range in House District 10. He is a small-business owner and advocate and serves on the Legislative Small Business Task Force. David and his wife Susan operate the Northwest Winds kite stores, and Gomberg Kite Productions, an award-winning manufacturer and wholesaler of kite products. They have performed around the world with their large showpieces and have appeared in motion pictures, television programs, and in music videos.



Senator Ron Wyden (D-Ore.)

As the Senate's leading voice for bipartisanship, Senator Wyden has a long history of working across the aisle. He has sought common ground for innovative policy approaches to some of the nation's most entrenched issues. Through a philosophy of principled bipartisanship, Senator Wyden has advanced a comprehensive tax reform proposal and improvements to Medicare that have garnered support from both sides of the aisle without sacrificing either side's guiding principles. He has been a leader in international trade and has worked to reduce trade barriers for U.S. agricultural products to the growing market for digital goods and services. As a member of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, Wyden has been at the vanguard of reforms to the nation's surveillance laws and a staunch supporter of privacy rights and civil liberties.

Wyden is the chairman of the Senate Committee on Finance, having served as that body's Trade Subcommittee chairman since 2009. He recently served as the chairman of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee and under his leadership the committee has been considered a model for bipartisan cooperation, having passed more legislation than any other committee. He also serves as a senior member on the Senate Budget Committee.

Wyden was first elected to Congress in 1980 to represent Oregon's 3rd District. In 1996, he was elected to the U.S. Senate in a special election, becoming the first federal official elected in an entirely vote-by-mail election.



Senator Jeff Merkley (D-Ore.)

A son of a millwright, Jeff Merkley was born in Myrtle Creek, Oregon. His family moved with the timber economy to Roseburg and then to East Multnomah County. Jeff began his career in public service as an intern with Oregon's former Senator Mark Hatfield. After working in Washington D.C. for a few years in both the Pentagon and at the Congressional Budget Office, Jeff came back to Oregon to work with families to build homes as the head of Portland's Habitat for Humanity. He was elected to the Oregon House of Representatives in 1998. In 2007, he became Speaker of the Oregon House and held that post until his election to the U.S. Senate. In 2009, he was sworn into the same senate seat once held by Mark Hatfield.

In the five and a half years he's been in office, Jeff has been a champion for Oregon working families and has fought to restore the "American Dream" for Oregonians. He's worked to end the risky Wall Street gambling that caused the 2008 financial crisis, boost Oregon manufacturing, reform the housing and payday lending industries on behalf of consumers, and to support Oregon's coastal economy through increased dredging and jetty repairs at ports along Oregon's coast.

In the Senate, Jeff serves on the Environment and Publics Works Committee; the Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs Committee; the Budget Committee; and the Appropriations Committee. He is the first Oregonian since Senator Mark Hatfield to sit on the Appropriations Committee in either the House or the Senate, and has used his seat on the committee to push for increased investments in Oregon's priorities, including resources for Oregon's returning troops, wildfire funding, and small port infrastructure.



Congressman Peter DeFazio, Oregon's 4th Congressional District

Congressman Peter DeFazio was first elected to the U.S. Congress in 1986 and is now the longest serving House member in Oregon's history. As the dean of the Oregon House delegation, he has developed a reputation as an independent, passionate and effective lawmaker.

Congressman DeFazio is the ranking member on the House Natural Resources Committee, which has jurisdiction over all federal lands, oceans, and fisheries. In his 26 years on the committee, DeFazio has served on every subcommittee, chaired a special task force on energy issues, and been involved in legislative battles on every issue before the committee impacting districts from Alaska to the Florida Keys, the Gulf of Maine to the Gulf of Mexico, and everything in between. Most recently, he was able to pass his balanced, bipartisan O&C solution that creates private sector jobs, provides revenues to failing counties, and permanently protects old growth and other irreplaceable environmental treasures.

Congressman DeFazio is a senior member of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, where he serves on the Highways and Transit Subcommittee, the Aviation Subcommittee, and the Railroad, Pipelines and Hazardous Materials Subcommittee. In 2005, DeFazio served as the ranking Democrat on the Highways Subcommittee where he helped negotiate a five-year federal highway and transit spending bill called SAFETEA-LU. Under the bill DeFazio secured \$2.7 billion for Oregon's roads, bridges, highways and transit systems.

Congressman DeFazio and his wife, Myrnie Daut, live in Springfield, Oregon.



Congressman Kurt Schrader, Oregon's 5th Congressional District

Congressman Kurt Schrader is currently serving his third term in the United States House of Representatives. He represents Oregon's 5th Congressional District, which includes all of Marion, Polk, Lincoln and Tillamook counties, as well as the bulk of Clackamas and small portions of Multnomah and Benton counties. Before being elected to Congress, Schrader, a farmer and veterinarian for more than 30 years, established and managed the Clackamas County Veterinary Clinic in Oregon City and operated his farm where he grew and sold organic fruit and vegetables.

In 1996, Congressman Schrader was elected to the Oregon State House of Representatives. There he served as a member of the Joint Ways & Means Committee. Schrader was one of five legislators asked by their peers to guide Oregon through the budget crisis of 2001-2002. Schrader was elected to the Oregon State Senate in 2003 and was immediately appointed to chair the Joint Way & Means Committee. He continued to serve in that capacity until he was elected to U.S. Congress in 2008.

Congressman Schrader attended Cornell University where he received his BA in Government in 1973. He received his veterinary degree from the University of Illinois in 1977.

Congressman Schrader currently serves as a member of the House Committee on Agriculture, House Committee on Small Business and House Budget Committee. Schrader serves on the House Committee on Small Business Subcommittees on Health and Technology, as well as Agriculture, Energy and Trade. He is the ranking member of the House Committee on Agriculture Subcommittee on Horticulture, Research, Biotechnology and Foreign Agriculture. Schrader is also the co-chair for Communications for the Blue Dog Coalition and co-chair of the New Democrat Coalition's Health Care Reform Taskforce.



Congresswoman Suzanne Bonamici, Oregon's 1st Congressional District

Suzanne first moved to Oregon from Michigan in the mid-1970s. She attended Lane Community College prior to earning a Bachelor of Science from the School of Journalism at the University of Oregon and a J.D. from the University Of Oregon School Of Law. After law school, Suzanne was an attorney for the Federal Trade Commission in Washington D.C., where she was in the Credit Practices Division of the Bureau of Consumer Protection. She met her husband, Michael H. Simon, in Washington, and in 1986 they settled in Portland.

In 2007, Suzanne was elected to her first term in the Oregon House of Representatives, representing House District 34 in Washington County. A year later, Suzanne was appointed to the Oregon Senate to represent District 17. Suzanne was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in a special election in January 2012.

She represents the First Congressional District of Oregon, which comprises the Northwest portion of the state. As a member of the Committee on Education and the Workforce, Suzanne focuses on closing the skills gap, making college more affordable, and reforming the Early Childhood and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as No Child Left Behind. Suzanne also serves as a member of the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and she is the Democratic leader on the Subcommittee on the Environment. From this position, she is working to address the causes and risks of global climate change, and to ensure that policy decisions are based on scientific evidence. As a representative of coastal Oregon, she is also working to draw attention to issues that affect this unique region, including ocean acidification, early tsunami warning systems, weather monitoring, and debris removal.



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Commissioner Brad Avakian, Oregon Bureau of Labor Industries

Born in Washington County, Brad is the proud product of Oregon's public schools. Brad married his high school sweetheart, Debbie, and they are now raising their children Nathan and Claire just a few miles from their own childhood homes.

Brad holds a B.A. from Oregon State University and a J.D. from Lewis and Clark Law School. He worked his way through law school by helping to create the local YMCA's Juvenile Restitution Program. Over the next 15 years, Brad dedicated his life to representing middle class families, work which continued to be a top priority during his time in the Oregon Legislature. In 2008, after leading a diverse coalition of cities, industry, tribes, environmental groups and farmers to design and pass the legislation to bring desperately needed water to Oregon's farms and rural communities, Brad was appointed by then-Governor Ted Kulongoski to the post of Bureau of Labor Industries Commissioner (BOLI) and later won statewide for the position.

Since 2008, Brad has teamed up with both business and labor to protect workers on the job and ensure that people are trained for the high-wage, high-demand jobs of the future. Brad also co-founded the Oregon League of Conservation Voters' Washington County Chapter and was appointed by Governor Barbara Roberts to lead the State Board of Psychologist Examiners.



Senator Ted Ferrioli, R-John Day, SD 30

Senator Ferrioli is the most senior member of the Senate, serving since his election in 1996. He has been Chair or Vice Chair of most Senate committees and was elected as Senate President Pro-Tem in 2004. He has served as the Senate Republican Caucus Leader since 2003, and last year was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Capitol Foundation. In 2011 he received both the Democrat and Republican nomination and received more than 98% of the votes cast.

In 2013, Ferrioli, House Republican Leader Mike McLane, Senate President Peter Courtney, House Speaker Tina Kotek and Governor John Kitzhaber successfully negotiated the Grand Bargain compromise which reduced unfunded PERS debt by \$4.5 billion, created the largest small business tax cut in Oregon history, increased K-12 school funding by \$1 billion and preempted Counties from enacting GMO measures.



Cylvia Hayes, First Lady of Oregon; Director, 3E Strategies

Cylvia Hayes is founder and CEO of 3EStrategies, a clean economy consulting firm, and First Lady of Oregon. She is a Fellow and on the Board of Directors of the American Leadership Forum Oregon. Cylvia has 23 years of professional experience in sustainable energy, economic development, green jobs, green building and sustainable forestry and agriculture. She co-chaired the Oregon Renewable Energy Working Group, which developed the state Renewable Energy Standard, Renewable Fuels Standard and other clean energy policies.

Cylvia has been honored as a Top 50 Leader in Oregon by Oregon Business Magazine, a Top 40 Under 40 by Cascade Business News and as a Central Oregon Earth Star. She has a Master's degree in Environmental Studies from Evergreen State College.

Raised as a farm kid, Cylvia was driving trucks and running chainsaws by the time she was 10 years old and has worked as a horse trainer, apple picker, fryer-chicken catcher, and heavy-equipment operator, among many other things. In her early 30s, she became the first person in her family to earn a graduate degree.

Edward John Ray, President, Oregon State University

Dr. Edward J. Ray became president of Oregon State University in July 2003.

Under his leadership, OSU has completed and updated a visionary campus-wide strategic plan. Annual research awards and contracts have increased substantially and exceeded \$260 million in fiscal year 2013. Dr. Ray and the OSU Foundation launched the university's first comprehensive fundraising campaign. The campaign total now exceeds \$1.06 billion, and the campaign which was initially launched with a goal of \$625 million will close at the end of 2014.

Dr. Ray served on the NCAA Executive Committee from 2007 to 2012 and as chair from October 2009 to August 2012. He currently serves on the boards of AAC&U, ACE and the SMTI Commission of APLU, and recently served as chair of the PAC-12 CEO group.

Dr. Ray was a member of the economics faculty at Ohio State University from 1970 to 2003, serving as economics department chair from 1976 to 1992. He later served as an associate provost; senior vice provost, receiving the Ohio State University Distinguished Service Award in 2006; and, from 1998 to 2003, as executive vice president and provost. Dr. Ray graduated cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa with an undergraduate degree in mathematics from Queens College. He earned his master's and doctorate degrees in economics from Stanford University.

- Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals' 2-1 decision overturning the Forest Service's assessment of the environmental impacts of proposed amendments to management plans for eleven Sierra Nevada national forests in *United States Forest Service v. Pacific Rivers Council*
- *Rocky Mountain Farmers Union v. Corey*, No. 12-15131 (9th Cir. Sep. 18, 2013), the court vacated a lower court injunction against application of a California regulation that establishes caps on average carbon intensities of transportation fuels consumed in California.
- *Sackett v. US EPA: Drowning the Agency Enforcement Scheme*
