# Senate Democrats Build an Oregon that Works for You and Your Neighbors

Statement from Senate Majority Leader Kate Lieber on adjournment of the 2023 Legislative Session

**SALEM, Ore** - Oregon's 82nd Legislative Assembly adjourned the 2023 Legislative Session today having delivered major victories for the people of Oregon. Senate Democrats stood up to political obstruction to build an Oregon that works for everyone. Caucus members prioritized legislation fixing the homelessness crisis and building affordable housing, making Oregon communities safer, growing family-wage jobs and reducing the cost of living, ensuring access to vital health care, supporting a sustainable environment and protecting against wildfires, investing in Oregon's students and schools, and promoting good government.

Senate Majority Leader Kate Lieber (D - Beaverton & SW Portland) issued the following statement on the major wins Senate Democrats delivered for the people of Oregon:

"Senate Democrats showed up everyday and kept our promises to the people of Oregon. We did our jobs so every Oregonian, in every corner of the state, can live with dignity in safe, sustainable communities free from racism and discrimination with equal access to quality health care, world-class schools, and secure, good-paying careers.

"Senate Democrats are committed to listening to you and your neighbors, standing up for you and your community, and building an Oregon that works for all of us."

Senate Democrats' 2023 Oregon Works agenda focused on making life better for every Oregonian, from the waters of the Columbia to the Steens Mountains and the Rogue Valley and the Wallowas. Legislation passed to accomplish this goal includes but is not limited to:
