- Urgently expanding mental health and drug treatment
- Increasing access to Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Building up the drug treatment and mental health **workforce**

- Holding the treatment system **accountable**

Investing in Solutions

1 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND DRUG TREATMENT

Investing over \$97 million into our behavioral health and drug treatment system to make recovery more available than drugs and save lives from overdoses.

2 PREVENTION AND EDUCATION

Investing \$16.75 million in prevention and education to protect our kids from deadly drugs.



URGENTLY INCREASING ACCESS TO CARE

Standing up shovel-ready projects to expand drug treatment capacity (\$85.4M). Highlights include:

- Multnomah County Sobering and Drop Off Center - emergency behavioral health services and coordination between providers & public safety. (\$10M + additional general funding)
- Youth Outpatient Treatment from 4D Recovery in Portland (\$4M)
- BestCare Treatment Services in Madras New 16-bed facility for Latino men and Oregon's first women-specific Latina treatment facility. (\$1.5M)
- Klamath Basin Behavioral Health residential treatment facility with a crisis stabilization center. (\$2.4M)
- Ontario Medical Plaza project to convert vacant retail space into an integrated healthcare facility with supported housing units. (\$5.75M)




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INTERVENING ON PUBLIC DRUG USE, CONFISCATING HARD DRUGS

- Allowing confiscation of hard drugs
- Stopping public drug use with treatment-first accountability measures
- Getting drug dealers off the street
- Monitoring law enforcement interactions for racial and demographic disparities



BUILDING THE BRIDGE FROM PUBLIC SAFETY TO PUBLIC HEALTH

- **Community Mental Health Programs** to implement <u>deflection and diversion</u> (\$9.83 million)
- Oregon Behavioral Health <u>Deflection</u> Program (\$20.71 million)
- Specialty courts across Oregon (\$12.16 million)
- **Community corrections** systems (\$16 million)
- Boost public defense attorney capacity (\$12.19 million)
- Law school clinics to boost our public defense workforce (\$2.06 million)
- **\$7.6 million** to ensure program investments are run smoothly

Prevention & Education

- New school curricula on the dangers of synthetic opioids (\$1.99 million)
- Drug Endangered Children Grants (\$750,000)
- **Grants to relief nurseries** that offer early childhood therapeutic and family support services (\$2.7 million)
- Grants to Nurse Family Partnerships to support vulnerable parents expecting their first child (\$3.16 million)
- Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center grants to provide education, mentoring, and employment training (\$1 million)
- Grants to **restorative justice** programs (\$400,000)
- Grants to East Metro Outreach Prevention and Intervention Program to connect with young people to prevent violence (\$2.5 million)
- Grants to a jail re-entry pilot program to facilitate community-based reentry and care coordination for formerly incarcerated individuals (\$500,000)
- Grants to **Women's First Transition Center** to support women rebuilding their lives after incarceration (\$150,000)
