Oregon Senate Democrats Call on Federal Government to End Campaign of Violence and Intimidation

SALEM, Ore. – Oregon Senate Majority Leader Kayse Jama (D – E Portland, Boring & Damascus) and many of his colleagues signed on to letters sent today to the Trump administration and Oregon’s U.S. Congressional delegation condemning the violence of ICE agents and asking for a halt to the federal government’s aggression.

The letters described ICE arresting people without warrants and without regard to immigration status and called the shooting of Renee Good and Alex Petti in Minnesota “terrifying escalations in federal aggression that has been rising since President Trump took office.”

Majority Leader Jama and the other signers called on the federal government to end ICE operations, stop funding ICE, and remove current Department of Homeland Security leadership. The state senators also reaffirmed their commitment to defend civil liberties in Oregon law.
