### **Oregon Tax Dollars Are Headed Back to the Portland Area in Local Community Investments**

*Oregon Senate Democrats voted to bring more than \$387 million back to the region*

**SALEM, OR** – Oregon families thrive best when they can count on job opportunities, housing, education, and safety. New state investments in infrastructure will expand those possibilities. In spending bills passed last month, Oregon Senate Democrats voted to allocate about \$488 million to support community projects all across the state. More than \$387 million is slated to go to the Portland metro area.

“Success is about partnership,” said **Senate Majority Leader Kayse Jama (D – E Portland, Boring & Damascus)**. “Funding local government facilities, community-based projects, and economic development activities leads to some of the most lasting, tangible benefits we can create as a state government.”

State funding is approved for the following projects in the Portland metro area:

- Banks Fire District 13, Hornshuh Creek Fire Station #14 safety improvements: \$173,000
- Clackamas County, Clackamas County Recovery Campus: \$5 million
- Moda Center renovations: \$365 million
- Our Home Inclusive Community Collaborative, Cathedral Park Cohousing: \$1,400,000
- Native American Youth & Family Center, facilities upgrades and roof replacement: \$4 million
- Williams & Russell CDC business hub: \$11.5 million
