State Revenue Remains High, But Economic Warning Signs Are Flashing

SALEM, Ore. – The quarterly [revenue forecast](#) shows that Oregon’s tax revenues remain strong, but troubling economic trends continue to emerge. Oregon lags behind the nation in job growth, population gain, and GDP, while key industries that provide sustainable, family-wage jobs like construction and manufacturing are struggling. Meanwhile, government jobs and government-subsidized sectors continue to grow at a rapid pace.

Senate Republican Leader Daniel Bonham (R-The Dalles) released the following statement:

“Oregon is raking in tax dollars, but the foundation of our economy is weakening. If we keep losing working-age Oregonians and making it harder for businesses to thrive, this won’t be sustainable in the long run. We need to focus on policies that support job creation in industries that actually build things, not just grow government.”
