Thatcher Fights to Fund Bypass

At a recent <u>Oregon Transportation</u>
<u>Commission Meeting</u>, Rep Thatcher
lobbied to get new federal funding spent



on the <u>Newberg-Dundee Bypass</u>. Instead, the Commission diverted more than \$200 million dollars to a variety of other programs, many not related to roads. A recent <u>court decision</u> has upheld land use decisions related to the 11-mile long project. Another <u>public hearing</u> is set for Jan 12th in Dundee.
